Col. Bill Mulock was elected member of parliament for the historic riding of North York in Monday's byelection with a majority of about 3,700 votes. It is a record majority for this constituency and is a striking tribute to the popularity of the Liberal candidate and unmistakeable evidence of the unpopularity of the Bennett government.

The great swing in support of Col. Mulock was in evidence in every part of the riding and in practically every polling sub-division he led his opponent with substantial majorities.

The vote in Richmond Hill gave a Liberal majority of 90 as compared with a majority for the late Col. Lennox of 75 in the last federal election. As soon as the local result was made known it was taken as an indication of the swing in the entire riding. Early returns gave Col. Mulock a substantial lead and from the first the result was never in doubt.
