I am sorry that I have neglected to write to you to tell you that the carload of fruit and vegetables donated by your district arrived at Huntoon in first class condition.

I will assure you that we are very thankful and the contents were gratefully received by everyone, as there were no potatoes or vegetables grown in this district.

The carload was divided between Viewfield and Huntoon points, Benson the third point on this field had been served.

Out of our half share we served fifty-six families. Each family received 2 bags of potatoes, 6-8 heads of cabbage and two bags filled with other vegetables. We are forever grateful to the people of Richmond Hill, Gormley, Victoria Square and district who so kindly contributed to this carload.
