He also pointed out that the Hon. Alexander Mackenzie, able and incorruptible Scotch statesman who actually worked as a journeyman in the construction of the old Parliamentary library at Ottawa and on the Royal Military College at Kingston, and rose to be the Prime Minister of Canada, represented the riding of East York at the time of his death in 1892. A deep treasured tradition with Mr. MacGregor is that the Hon. Alexander Mackenzie and Mr. Mac-Gregor's late father Patrick Mac-Gregor, who was founder of the Toronto Gaelic Society, were close friends, and Hon. Alexander Mackenzie was a pallbearer at the late Patrick MacGregor's funeral in 1882. Lord Dufferin declared that Hon. Alexander Mackenzie was the very soul of honour and one of the noblest public men in British history.
