Acclamation Likely For Village Municipal Council

KEEN FIGHTS EXPECTED IN MARKHAM AND VAUGHAN

Although municipal nomination day in Richmond Hill is only a few days distant the municipal pot shows no signs of boiling and in fact it doesn't even appear to be simmering. Not in many years has there been the entire absence of election rumors and election talk as is evident this year. A canvas of public opinion shows that there is satisfaction with the work of Reeve J. A. Greene and the members of the 1934 council and the consensus of opinion seems to be that there should be an acclamation this year. So far not a single person has declared his intention of contesting any office and it looks now as if next Monday night will see the 1934 council returned by acclamation.

The terms of five members of the Board of Education expire December 31st. The three elected members whose time is up at the end of this year are trustees P. E. Angle, L. A. Hill and A. D. Buchanan. It is likely all three will seek re-election and to date no one has declared the intention of opposing them. Trustee T. H. Trench who is a county appointee and trustee J. F. Atkinson an appointee of the Village council also complete their appointed term at the end of the year.

However, if things municipal are quiet in Richmond Hill there is plenty of election talk in the neighboring townships. In Vaughan township Reeve George Kellam, who is said to be sure of the 1935 York County Wardenship if he returns as Vaughan's representative, is seeking re-election and according to persistent rumor he will have opposition. Ex-Reeve James Robson is likely to be his opponent and if there is an election there will likely be a general change about with several new aspirants for the council seats. Councillor Robert W. Scott is a likely contender for the office of deputy-reeve and it will not be known until nomination day just what move the present deputy-reeve Robert W. Dooks will make. He will have his choice of contesting the deputy-reeveship with councillor Bob Scott or stepping up and contesting the reeveship in a probable three cornered fight. It is likely councillors Duncan McMurchy and Boynton Weldrick will seek re-election to seats on the council. Then there are rumors of several new aspirants, but just how many of them materialize will be known nomination day.

In Markham township, also it looks like another election year. Former councillor Fred A. Coakwell, who has served some six years in the council, has announced that he is a candidate for deputy-reeve in which case it is likely deputy-reeve Will Clark will be a candidate for reeve. It is understood Reeve G. B. Padget will seek re-election and whether or not there will be a third candidate remains to be seen. The appointment of Charles Hoover, a member of council, as treasurer leaves a vacant chair for which it is anticipated there will be several aspirants. Councillors Rennie and Hooper will probably be candidates for re-election. Among the list of probable candidates prominently mentioned are ex-reeve W. C. Gohn and former deputy-reeve R. L. Stiver.

In North York Township, Reeve Earl Bales and all members of the 1934 council have opposition and a lively campaign is now under way in the southern township.

In King Township it is very likely there will be a contest for the various offices and an election fight looms as a probability in Whitechurch. Nomination meetings in the townships will be held next Monday afternoon and in Richmond Hill Village the nomination meeting is in the evening.
