FIFTY YEARS AGO

From Our Issue of April 2nd, 1885 On Monday last, Mr. Hodgson, Senior Inspector of High Schools, paid our High School a visit. He spent some five or six hours in examining, or hearing examined, the various classes. As was to be expected, he was rather reticent in expressing an opinion on the state of affairs, but the little he did say seemed to indicate satisfaction with the state of the school. On one point, however, he was outspoken, and that was the entire unfitness of the present quarters for school purposes.

The ladies of the Methodist Church, Richmond Hill, are giving their annual Dinner and Tea in the Lecture Room of the church on the 25th of May next and will be pleased to cater to the wants of their numerous friends who attend the Spring Fair on that date. A grand concert will be given in the church in the evening for which the best talent in the province has been secured.

A special meeting of the Village Council was held in the Council Chambers on Thursday evening, March 26th, the Reeve in the chair. Members present, Messrs. Redditt, McConaghy, Savage and Powell. The Clerk read the agreement signed by Mr. John Palmer, in reference to change of land for Village Park, which report was adopted by the Council. By-law No. 110, relating to change of Park was read a first, second and third time and passed, and seal of the Corporation was attached thereto. On motion, Mr. Teefy was authorized to do the necessary conveyancing in reference to deed for park, and to have the 41/2 acres properly surveyed by a land surveyor. Mr. A. J. Rupert was appointed a member of the Board of Health, in place of J. K. Falconbridge, refused. Council adjourned.

On Monday night fire destroyed the home of Mr. Jesse Goode, West of Wilson's pond, caused by stovepipes which ignited the roof. Fortunately the buildings and contents were pretty well insured.
