YORK COUNTY DRAMA FESTIVAL

As a result of the great interest shown in dramatic art throughout York County and with a view to stimulating and encouraging this, a committee has been formed to arrange for the holding of a Drama Festival at Newmarket, dates having been set for April 22nd, 24th, 29th and May 1st, 1936.

This festival will consist of a series of one act plays having a time limit of 40 minutes and is open to any group or organization in York County, exclusive of the City of Toronto.

The only fee to be charged the entrants will be an entry fee of \$5.00 and this will be refunded after the performance of their play.

It is the intention and desire of the committee to make this an annual festival, hoping that in subsequent years the winners will be able to successfully compete in the larger festivals.

Rules Governing Contest

- 1. One act play—time limit forty minutes. 2. Open to any group in York County exclusive of City of Toronto. 3. Entries must be in by March 10th; copy of play to be submitted with entry, and to be subject to approval of committee. 4. Entry fee of five dollars must accompany application, to be refunded after performance. 5. Individual players may act in only one play, but any organization may enter more than one group. 6. The committee will be responsible for obtaining independent judges. 7. Program must start at 8.15 prompt each evening. 8. Each group will be responsible for their own furniture, scenery, make up, costumes, etc. 9. The committee will provide a simple standard interior setting for those unable to supply their own. 10. Any group desirous of putting on dress rehearsal, may arrange to come and do so by consulting committee. 11. The first three evenings of the contest, four if necessary, shall be regarded as preliminaries and the three best plays shall be chosen to compete on the final night. 12. If the play to be presented is subject to royalty, entrants must submit proof that same has been paid by day of performance. 13. Dates are set for April 22nd, 24th, 29th and May 1st, subject to change or adjustment later. 14. Address all communications to H. M. Gladman, Secretary, Drama Festival Committee, Newmarket.
