### FIVE RICHEST MEN IN ENGLAND

England's five richest men are: Bored Hugh Richard Arthur Grosvenor, second Duke of Westminster...lands. Shy Sir John Reeves Ellerman...shipping.

Pugnacious Harold Harmsworth, Viscount Rothermere...Newspapers. Practical William Richard Morris, Baron Nuffield...automobiles. Plain Joseph Rank...flour mills. Plain Joe Rank, probably richest of all, is the only one without a title. He has refused one twice, saying: "I'm Joe Rank to everyone. They wouldn't know me as 'Sir Joseph'." He's probably the least known of all five. Yet his mills turn out 173,000 sacks of flour a week—enough to feed one-seventh of Britain's population.

He is ardently religious. He has given more than \$5,000,000 to the Methodist Church alone. To the poor invalids' fund of his native city, Hull, he wrote out a cheque for £300,000 (\$500,000).

Has Done Everything Londoners know the Duke of Westminster as the "Mon Who Owns London." Actually, he owns 600 acres of city property there, worth conservatively \$100,000,000.

This land was once a bog. He is the kind of aristocrat who appeals to readers of Sunday supplements. He has done everything, been everywhere.

He owns an estate in Scotland, 30,000 acres in Cheshire and Flintshire, two yachts. He has been married three times, hunted all over the world, hydroplaned, motorboated, led a British polo team to America, been under fire in war, gave his wife—his third—a wedding party in four houses.

He is said to be ridden by boredom. His heir died in infancy. A cousin is in line for the title.

Is Rarely Seen London newspapers like to refer to Sir John Ellerman as the "Man Nobody Knows." He easily outdistanced Greta Garbo and Charles Augustus Lindbergh in his passion for seclusion.

He is only 26. He owns four major steamship lines and a miscellaneous fleet of other vessels which are found on every sea.

He is rarely seen at his office or anywhere else. No one knows his home address. When his father died, the British government took \$70,000,000 in death duties.

Is a Dictator Viscount Rothermere probably is the best known of Britain's quintet of money lords. The brother of the late Lord Northcliffe, he is feared and admired in the British newspaper world.

A master of making fortunes from newspapers, Rothermere is described as a lonely man.

Two of his three sons were killed. He never got over their deaths.

Rothermere is said to love the good things of life—luxury, travel, entertainment, good company. He hates to be alone. He is fond of dictators and is one himself in his own world.

At 68 he is still vigorous, mentally and physically.

Self-Made Man Last among the five British men of wealth—Lord Uffield is a great industrialist, versatile, tremendously hard working, shrewd, practical.

He got his start making bicycles. In 1912 he switched to motorcycles. When the war came he was making automobiles. Today he is the Henry Ford of England.

Outside of golf, work is his life. He is the perfect self-made man.

He regards every failure at the fault of the person who failed.
