A total of 3,339,900 sheep on Canadian farms as at December 1, 1937, was an increase of 48,300 over the number at the corresponding date in 1936. There was also an increase of 300,000 in the number of sheep on farms in the United States, bringing the total in that country up to 52,900,000.

As a means of increasing employment in Orillia and at the same time provide a remedy for the shortage of homes, the Orillia Board of Trade is taking steps to obtain Government approval of a proposal to guarantee a fixed tax rate of thirty mills for a period of five years for all new buildings in Orillia.

For the third year in succession, average values of occupied farm lands in Canada are estimated at \$24 per acre. Farm land values have been declining since 1928 when they were reported at \$38 per acre.
