General News & Views

Next Monday is Thanksgiving Day.

The world breathes easier now that the war scare has passed.

It is fortunate the war was settled without calling out the Richmond Hill home guard.

Several patches of the deadly marijuana weed have been discovered growing on a vacant lot in the town of Uxbridge.

A deaf mute recently appeared in Newmarket police court charged with seeking alms. When taken in custody he had \$80 in his pockets.

The annual plowing match of the East York Plowmen's Assoc. will be held on Wednesday, November 2nd. The place set for the match is on the one hundred acre farm formerly owned by Thos. Shadlock, lot 24, con. 4, Scarboro, about a mile east of Clarke Corners. It is a fine farm for this outstanding match.

A peculiar accident occurred while stook threshing operations were in progress on the farm of Mr. Bert Stinson, Minto township, when one of Mr. John Wilkinson's team driven up to the thresher with a load of grain, swished its tail which caught in the thresher with the result that most of the tail was torn away, including about eight inches of the bone. The animal has since been in charge of a veterinary and is expected to recover.

A new type of burglar who break into homes when the occupants are away shopping or visiting friends and pile everything in sight on a truck has invaded Barrie. Recently such sneak thieves cleared out the entire furniture of one Barrie home in an isolated spot. Two boys walked past, but did not suspect a burglary although they saw the thieves. "We thought the family were moving," they told the police. Residents of other towns should take precautions lest this type of burglary spreads.

Farmers of Simcoe County are being advised to check their herds in pasture at once and report any deficiencies to the police. Six men have been arrested charged with thefts of cattle in Tiny Township, and thefts have also been reported in Sunnidale and Tecumseh townships. Provincial Constable Elliott, Alliston, reported the theft of eight head of cattle from the Percy Sample estate, lot 7, con. 7, Tecumseh. They were mostly two-year-old Herefords and Durhams. The arrested men are from the northern part of the County and have been remanded to appear in Midland.

FORTY YEARS AGO

From our Issue of October 6th, 1898
At a special meeting recently held the Municipal Council of the town of Newmarket decided to grant the Metropolitan Railway exemption from taxation (except for school purposes) for a period of ten years. The townships of King and Whitchurch have also granted the company exemption, but similar privileges have not been extended by the Aurora Council.

Engineer W. T. Jennings went north a few mornings ago with County engineer J. McDougall and J. W. Moyes, one of the objects being to see if an overhead bridge could be erected over the Northern railway one mile south of Aurora. The engineers reported that little difficulty would be experienced in getting across. The bridge will likely be erected a little to the east of Yonge St.

Markham Fair 1898

Markham Fair, which opened yesterday, will be continued today and tomorrow. All school children from York and Ontario Counties will be admitted today for 5 cents. Schools will march in procession to the Fair grounds at 1 p.m. headed by the 48th Highlanders' Band. The Highlanders' Band will also give a concert in the Town Hall this Thursday evening. The speeding contests in the ring will be as follows: Thursday—Stallion trot or pace; running race; 2:30 trot or pace; farmers' trot or pace; pony race. Friday—Free-for-all trot or pace; running race; 2:40 trot or pace; 3 minute trot or pace; pony race. The Unionville Band will furnish music during both days of the exhibition. A banquet will be held on the evening of the last day of the exhibition.

If the project materializes via Yonge Street the road would probably diverge near Langstaff and while paralleling the highway, would not be upon it, the company having adopted the "pay-as-you-go" plan as more satisfactory all round.
