### Declares Trade Is Key to Peace

Outstanding Business Leader Praises Trade Pact

Fifteen months of interviews with political, financial and industrial leaders in twenty-one countries have convinced Thomas J. Watson, New York, president of the International Chamber of Commerce, that people everywhere want peace more than anything else, and that "honest co-operation among all nations will establish permanent peace."

Mr. Watson, who is also president of the International Business Machines Corporation, told 200 prominent Ontario business men this week that world trade and sound economic relations between nations were the key to world peace.

Mr. Watson praised the new trade pacts recently signed by Canada, United States and Great Britain as "important contributions to the peace and prosperity of the world."

"The reciprocal trade agreements just concluded are events of outstanding significance, not only to our respective countries, but to all the world, because they represent a sharp reversal of policies which have hampered trade," he said. "Nature has provided amply for the needs of mankind, but men have raised artificial barriers against the exchange of one good thing for another."

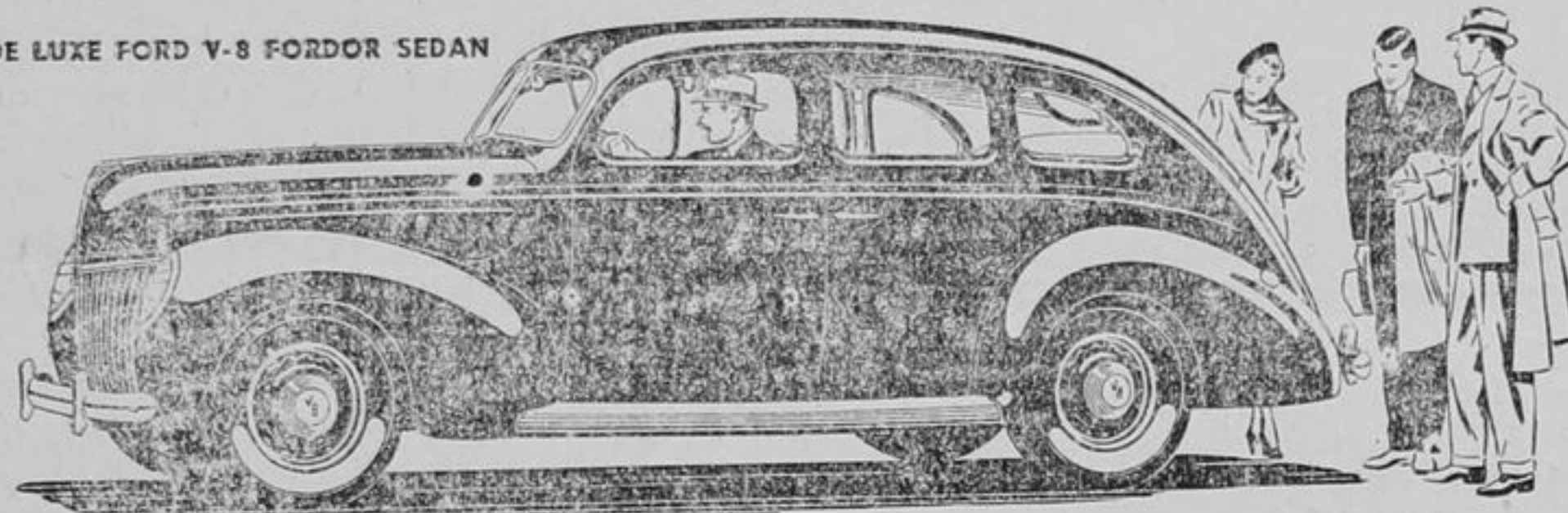

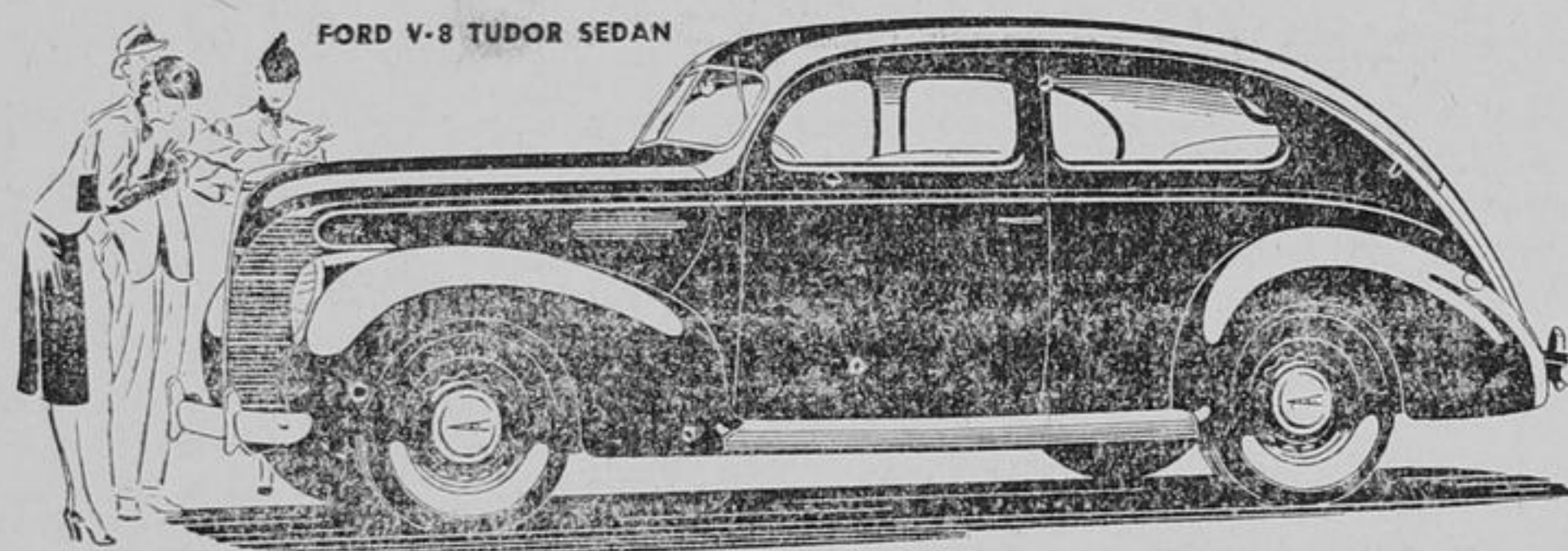

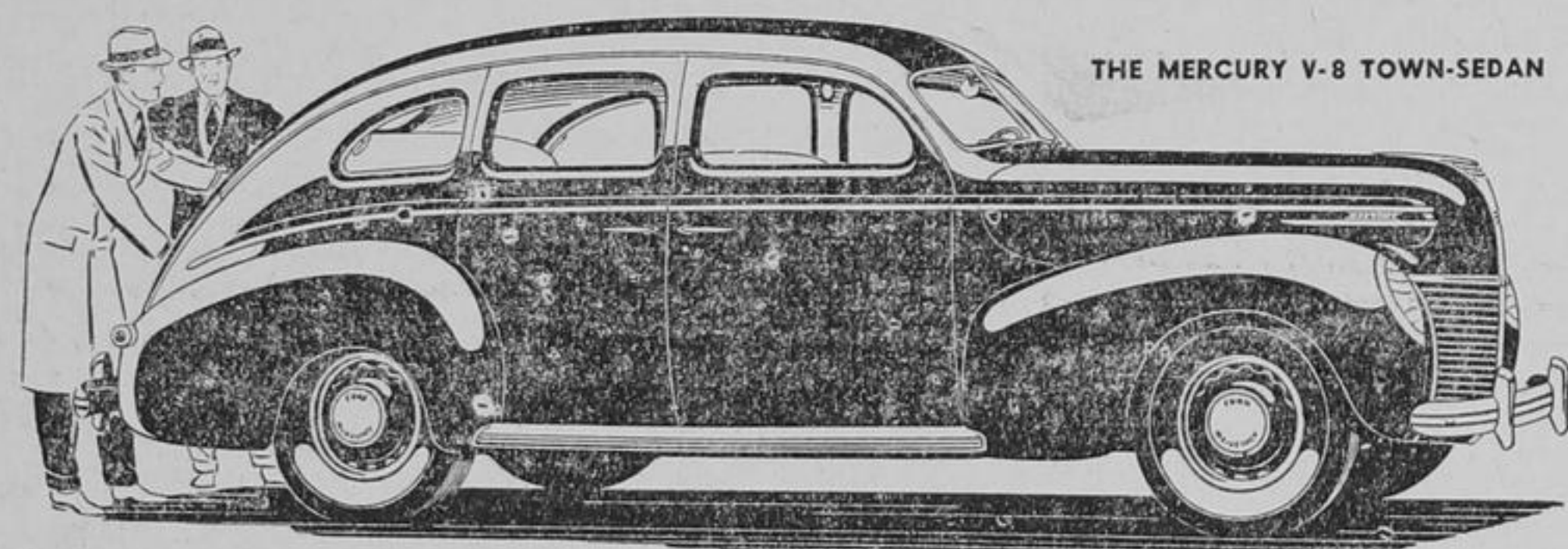
