On Sunday, May 21 the Thornhill churches will present a mammoth celebration in the school grounds commemorating the visit of the King and Queen to Canada. Rev. W. Harold Young, M.A., D.D., of St. Paul's Avenue Road United Church will be the guest speaker. Dr. Young will plant a tree in commemoration of the royal visit. The Revs. E. B. Cooke and J. H. Colclough will read passages of the scripture fitting the occasion. Benediction will be given by the Rev. J. D. Cunningham. The public school choir will provide the music. Mr. Percy Bone will be chairman. The service will be at 4 p.m. D.S.T.

The Rev. H. W. Garbutt, a missionary from Nigeria in British West Africa was the guest of Thornhill Anglican Church at Lawrence Memorial Hall last Sunday night. Rev. 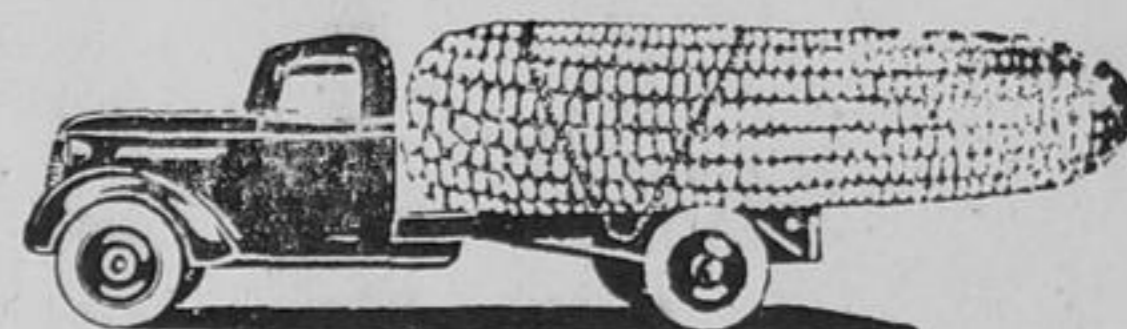

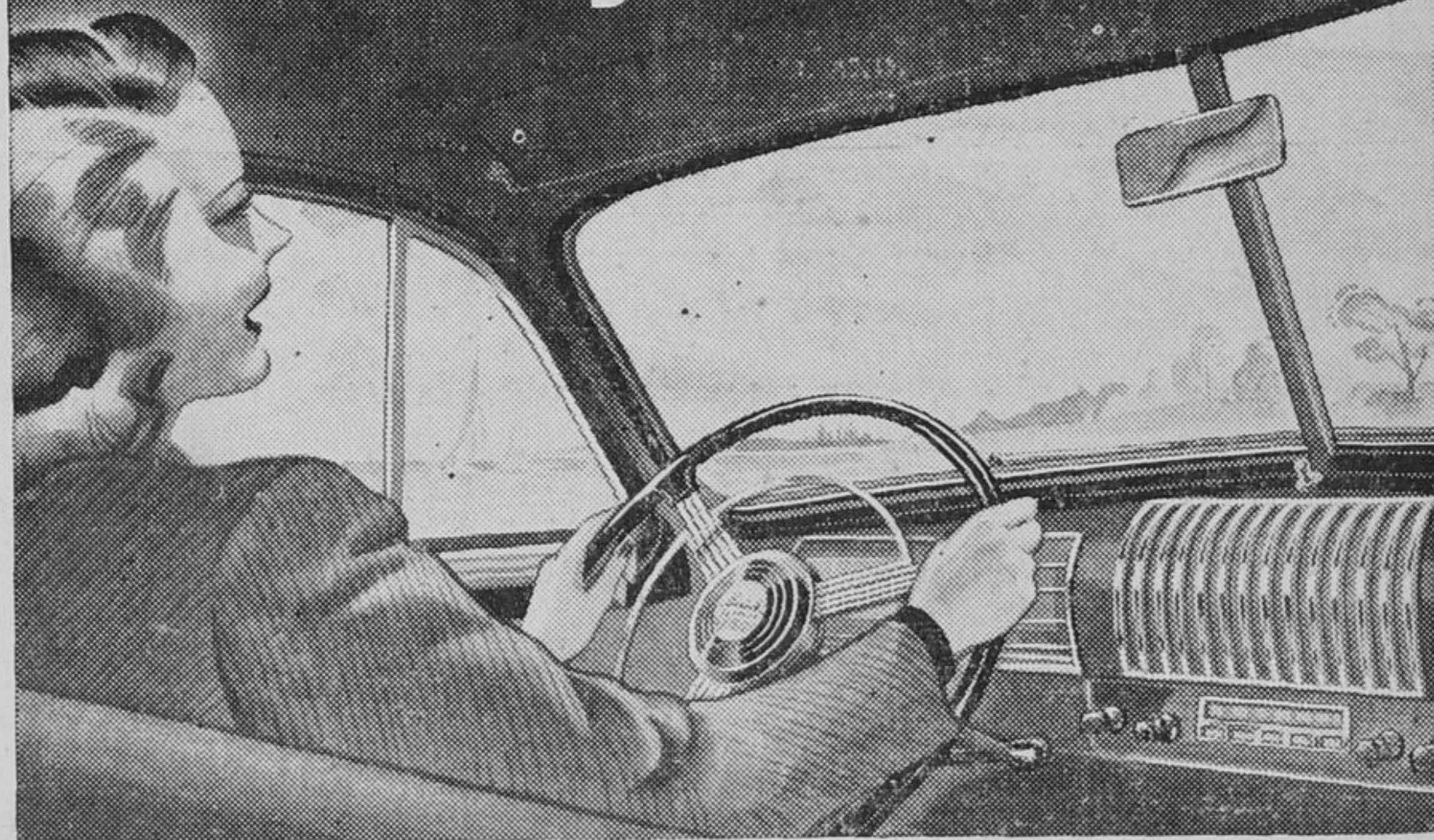
