NIAGARA FRUIT CROP THRIVING

Bumper Yield Is Seen by Agriculture Minister Dewan and Assistants On Inspection

Hon. P. M. Dewan, Ontario minister of agriculture, said "it looks like a bumper crop of fruit in the Niagara district this year," following a trip through the area.

Mr. Dewan was accompanied on his tour by P. W. Hodgetts, director of the Agriculture Department fruit branch, and E. F. Palmer, director of the horticultural experiment station, Vineland. Following a tour of the experiment station where 10,000 trees were in full bloom, the party motored to Niagara-on-the-Lake and visited the orchards of several growers.

"No fruits have missed fire this year," said Mr. Palmer. "Every kind of fruit tree was loaded with blossom. Prospects for an excellent crop of cherries, pears, peaches, plums and apples are exceedingly bright."
