It was felt that the taxpayers were unable to bear any extra levies on their tax bills at present.

Following the discussion the election of school trustees took place with N. L. Morton and Harry Simpkins being returned to office by acclamation. R. H. Neil was named to the board to replace Charles Smith, who tendered his resignation.
