C. P. R. Promotion



The promotion of H. C. James, assistant general passenger agent, Canadian Pacific Railway Company, Montreal to the similar post in charge of the Ontario District, with headquarters at Toronto, has been announced by George E. Carter, general passenger agent of the company. Mr. James succeeds the late C. B. Andrews and takes over his new duties November 1st. Mr. James in his 25 years' experience with the Canadian Pacific Railway has covered a wide field in Canada and the United States, embracing positions of ever increasing importance and responsibility.

YORK MARKET

An abundance of tender young salad greens supplemented the winter root vegetables on North York market stands this week. Leaf lettuce, radishes, watercress, peppercress and green onions sold at 3 for 10c. Celery was 10c bunch, savy and hard cabbages 5c to 10c. Spinach at 10c and 15c a basket was among the green things offered, while for those whose budget would allow, there were peas, beans, broccoli and new cabbage.

Root vegetables sold at 10c a 2-qt. box, potatoes at 20c a basket, onions 25c, bunches of carrots with tops on were 2 for 5c. Tomatoes were 20c a box, mushrooms 30c a lb.

Rhubarb was plentiful, first quality selling at 8c a bunch, 2 for 15c, and lower grade at 5c bunch. There were several kinds of good apples, including Spies, McIntosh, Delicious, Greenings, Russets, Tolman Sweets and Baldwins at 30c and 35c for No. ones, with domestics at 20c and 25c. Black walnuts were 10c quart, grapes 2 lbs. for 25c.

Roasting chickens were 23c and 25c lb., spring broilers 35c, capons 28c, boiling fowl 20c. Turkeys were 35c, ducks 28c, rabbits 25c.

On the fish market, trout, herring and whitefish provided a choice. Butter sold at 30c and 31c lb., eggs from 23c to 30c a dozen. Old cheese was 28c a lb., new 25c, cottage 10c each. Fresh pasteurized whipping cream was 35c pint.

Meat prices were as follows:
Beef: Porterhouse 27c, sirloin 24c, round 23c, rolled rib 23c to 28c, short rib 19c, blade 16c to 18c, brisket 10c.
Pork: Loin 27c, butt 22c, leg 24c, shoulder 17c. Bacon: Back 45c, side 28c, cottage roll 25c. Sausages 18c or 2 for 35c, beef suet 2 lbs. for 25c, lard 15c a lb., dripping 10c.

Plenty of choice in variety and price could be found on the flower stands, where pots of flowering bulbous plants and the cut blooms vied for favor. Daffodils were 50c a bunch up, narcissi 35c, freesia 60c, tulips 75c, potted plants from 15c each up. Among the smaller flowers, variously priced, were bunches of pansies, sweet peas forget-me-nots and marigolds. The potted plants included African violets, polyanthus, begonias, primulas and cyclamen.

Minutes of last meeting held at Palgrave were read by the clerk and on motion were adopted by the council and signed by the reeve and clerk.

A number of communications were read and dealt with in council.

Council resolved itself into committee of the whole with Mr. Steele Anderson in the chair.

Mr. Norrie asked leave to address the council re a culvert on the 3rd line. T. R. Evans waited on the council re the purchase of fire equipment for the village of Caledon East.

Moved by J. Anderson, seconded by J. E. Patterson that Mr. Michael Horan receive the sum of \$39.00 for three sheep killed and one sheep injured and that Sam McMullin receive \$2.00 for valuing same, he having signed the necessary affidavit. Carried.

W. A. Irwin, express charges on assessor's and collector's rolls, 40c.; J. A. Ellis, damages to truck, \$10.25, this bill sent to Insurance Co. for adjustment; J. J. Jamieson, General Hospital, re Richard Seagraves, Nov. 6 to Nov. 21, 1939, laid over from last meeting, paid \$13.12; Municipal World, 8 subscriptions for council, \$8.00; Imperial Bank, Bolton, collecting taxes 1939, \$85.65; Ontario Hospital, Woodstock, re Bessie Town, bill \$45.50 (laid over); Miss Mary Haviland, rent of house re tax sale, Jan. 17 and Jan. 31, 1940, @ \$3.00, \$6.00; Miss Mary Haviland, rent of house for council meeting Feb 5th, \$3.00; Miss Eliza Matson, rent of house for special meeting Jan. 13, \$3.00; Alex Goodfellow, tax collector or month of January, 1940, \$18.68; Road Voucher No. 2, O.K'd by the Road Supt. and ordered paid by the council, \$382.75; Roofers Supply Co., 10,000 ft. snow fence and posts, \$952.75, (laid over); Relief Voucher No. 2 for month of January, 1940, \$85.36.

Moved by Mr. Steele, seconded by H. Wilson, that the treasurer be authorized to forward to J. N. Proctor the sum of \$41.50 as Albion's share of expenses of the Community Hall which was occupied by the pupils attending the Short Course. Carried.

Moved by J. E. Patterson, seconded by W. E. Downey, that this council grant the sum of \$100.00 to the Caledon East Memorial Hall to be applied to the reducing of the principal. Carried.

Moved by H. Wilson, seconded by J. E. Patterson, that this council accept the Auditor's Report as submitted at his meeting and that Mr. O'Leary receive \$55.00 for all expenses and services, also that the clerk be instructed to have 100 copies of this report printed. Carried.

Moved by W. E. Downey, seconded by J. E. Patterson, that we lay over bill re snow fence, (Roofers Supply Co.). Carried.

Moved by W. E. Downey, seconded by Mr. Steele, that this council now adjourn to meet at Irwin's Hotel, Palgrave, on Monday, March 4, 1940, at 10 o'clock a.m. Carried.
