'DESERTED VILLAGES' FULL OF LIFE AGAIN

Industry and Population Flow Back From Cities of England

London—Life is surging back to the little towns of Britain.

Thousands of quiet, oft-neglected places, some of them slowly starved for years by the movement of population and industry and ease of transport, now pulsate with a sudden return to joyful bustle.

These are the country towns, the villages and hamlets into which the evacuation tide has flowed.

Thousands of city children, parents and children stir them with laughter, fun and new accents. They swell the budgets of country housewives.

Shops and unoccupied houses have become emergency headquarters and branches of administrations, firms and industries. They absorb workless and bring in yet more spenders and their families. The countryside thrives with new blood.

Typical is Egham, near Staines, the place where Magna Carta was signed.

The chairman of the council, Rev. A. C. Tranter, is overjoyed.

"Shops are teeming with people," he said. "I think the population of Egham and its two associated townships, just over 17,000 normally, has increased by 50 per cent in a week. It may be doubled by the time settling-down is complete.

"For three years trade had dwindled. There were 32 empty shops. Now they are nearly all occupied by useful services. A big tobacco company has filled new premises with office staff. Perhaps a hundred people with their families have come to work there and live nearby. Other places have the same happy sort of tale."
