and Malloy. Minutes of last meet-
ing read and confirmed. The treas-
urer was ordered to pay road ac-
counts presented. Malloy-Kirby —
That the Treasurer pay H. Creigh-
ton, for Vaughan Agricultural Soci-
ety, \$25.00. Carried.

By-Law No. 719 was then passed
appointing Messrs. George F. Legge
and Dugald McDonald collectors of
taxes for the year 1900. Council
adjourned.
