SOLDIERS' MAIL

Increased Mail Volume Requires Increased Co-operation

Comparative figures released today by Hop. William P. Mulock, K.C. M.P., Postmaster General, indicate how the flow of Military mails has risen to formidable proportions during the past year, and lend emphasis to the need for the public's full cooperation in proper addressing and packing so that the most expeditious delivery may be effected.

During the calendar year of 1940 some 140,000 pounds of letters (approximately 5,600,000 letters), 596,-000 pounds of newsprint, and 3,260,-000 pounds of pancels passed through the Base Post Office, Canada, addressed to our soldiers abroad - a total weight of 1,998 tons!

The flood of mail through the Base Post Office for overseas shows a continuous uptrend as figures for the last two weeks in January indicate. For the week ending January 18th, approximately 156,440 letters and 24,559 parcels were despatched; and 307 bags of newsprint, weighing 16,181 pounds. The following week, ending January 25th, approximately 181,520 letters, 21,560 parcels; and 373 bags of newsprint weighing 19,082 pounds, were sent
