Poultry Pasture Helps Cut Costs Of Feeding

Details may be obtained by writing Poultry Department, O. A. C., Guelph, for circular No. 54 "Pastures for Poultry".

"Some materials commonly used in poultry rations are now unobtainable. There is also a question as to whether the supply of our common grains will last until the 1942 crop is available, without some supplementary feeds," says Prof. F. N. Marcellus, head of the Poultry Dept.

"Pastures will be most vital this year in helping out any feed shortage. The problem is just as important with poultry as other classes of live stock."

"If you haven't a copy, send to the Poultry Department, Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, for the circular No. 54 "Pastures for Poultry" which gives this pasture programme in detail."

"Remember, good pastures will not only effect a very material saving in feed cost, but will enable you to grow very much better birds than is possible on a range that is practically bare or dried up most of the season."

"It is also a well established fact that birds on a clean range with plenty of succulent short forage of the right kind will show less evidence of diseases and parasitic infestations than where range and pasture conditions are poor."

Hay And Pasture Cheapest Source Of Animal Feed

A. H. Martin cites phenomenal hay yield on heavily fertilized plot on farm of Dr. L. H. Newman.

"Hay and pasture crops are our cheapest sources of animal feed. Maximum production must be attained in 1942 if Ontario farmers expect to provide sufficient feed for their ever increasing flocks and herds," states A. H. Martin, Assistant Director, Agricultural Representatives Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture, Toronto.

"The results of an experiment started in 1939 by W. B. George, Soils Specialist, Kemptville Agricultural School, on the farm of Dr. L. H. Newman at Merrickville, gives an excellent illustration of what can be done by establishing reasonable fertility levels in the soil," Mr. Martin continued.

"A 12 acre field of sandy loam soil was divided into 4 plots of 3 acres each. The rotation was 1939 —corn; 1940, oats; 1941, hay. In plot 1 an attempt was made to build up the fertility in the soil to normal levels and heavy applications of chemical fertilizer were applied amounting to 1,000 pounds per acre each of the three years, as well as 12 tons of manure the first year."

"Plot 2 received 250 pounds of 2-12-10 fertilizer per acre each year in addition to 12 tons of manure the first year."

"Plot 1 in three years yielded per acre, 18 tons corn, 48 bushels oats and 7.8 tons dry hay."

"The 1941 fertilizer application was applied as a top dressing to the new seeding in the early Spring."

When Tanker Capacity Is Cut

Each tanker that has to be taken off the run to Canada will cost Canadian motorists about 26 million gallons of gasoline. In terms of the average mileage of the Canadian motorist, as indicated last year in a sample survey by the Oil Controller, most Canadian passenger car drivers used up over 500 gallons of gasoline in a year (an important section burned more than three times that amount).

That means that every time a tanker goes down or has to be switched from the Canadian run, something like 52,000 passenger cars have to be taken off the road. And that figure is on the short side because we are getting less gasoline for ordinary drivers out of each lot of crude.

For Canada as a whole, the loss of a tanker puts roughly 5% of the total passenger car registration out of action. We have slightly more than 1.2 million passenger cars. To save eight tankers we thus have to cut our driving around 40%.—Financial Post.
