## Extra Sugar May Be Had By Farmers

Farm wives' worries about sugar for the extra hands at harvest time have been dispelled by a ruling of the sugar ration division of the War-time Prices and Trade Board. Special provision has been made to enable farmers' wives to obtain extra sugar.

Farmers' wives must provide pies, cakes and other sugar-containing foods in large quantities for threshing gangs and other harvest workers. Most farmers' wives know from experience how many men will come in the threshing gang and how long they will stay, therefore they know how much extra sugar will be needed.

To obtain this extra sugar the farmer's wife should apply in good time to the nearest sugar ration officer for a special purchase permit to obtain the sugar she requires. In her application she should state:

1. How many men she expects.
2. How long they will remain.
3. How many meals she expects to provide.
4. What quantity of sugar she expects to use.

The request will be scrutinized by the ration officer and, if it is found in order, he will issue a special purchase permit for a stated amount of sugar. The farmer's wife will present this purchase permit to her grocer or other supplier and it will be his authority to sell the exact amount indicated for the specific purpose stated.

### ABOUT DOGS

We have noticed, amongst those who possess dogs of the long-haired breeds, that a number of owners are inclined to shave their pets, being under the impression that the dog's fur only makes the animal hotter.

This is an error of judgment, as the dog with long fur is blessed with a natural protection against the penetrating heat of the sun's rays. If the coat is unusually heavy, thin a little, but do not strip it off. True enough, he may do quite a bit of panting, but then it must be remembered that a dog perspires by this method, and, like the human body, throws off an excess of undesirable elements by this means.

If your pet is more than a bit of a nuisance, where the beautiful, or very necessary gardens exist, how about putting him on a running chain, making sure there is one spot where he can seek the shade when needed.

If you own a pup, it will be much kinder — and healthier for the pup — if the children are not allowed to over handle during the hot days. And don't forget — your pet gets just as thirsty as you do — and as our songsters do.

### AGRICULTURE FIRST MUNITION OF WAR

Agriculture a Front-line Muniton of War" is the slogan of the Women's Land Army in Great Britain. The Women's Land Army is a mobile force of girls not previously employed in agriculture organized to meet the labour needs of agricultural employers. These girls, who have been giving valuable help to farmers for the past two years, are trained by the British Ministry of Agriculture which guarantees them a minimum wage. The Women's Land Army women replace men for active fighting, and there is no agricultural work that men can do that the women of the W.L.A. cannot do.
