Bird Chatter

We have many beautifully colored birds such as the baltimore oriole, the blue bird, rose breasted grossbeak, purple finch, indigo bunting and numerous others, but we don't think any of them could present such a striking and colorful picture as a pair of scarlet tanagers side by side on the branch of a tree with the greenness of the foliage for a background. We noticed the female tanager first in a cedar tree. The greenish yellow of her plumage attracted our eye and we noticed she was carrying some food in her bill so watched where she was going. We were rewarded shortly as we followed in the direction she had flown. the male tanager which caught our eye and presently the pair perched side by side on a limb for our admiration and delight. The male bird has a black wing and tail in striking contrast to the bright red plumage of the rest of the body. They are smaller than a robin and are found mostly in open woods. 
