**BOOKS IN SEVEN LANGUAGES  
TOTAL A MILLION COPIES SOLD**

When the Reverend Archer Wall-  
ace moved to the village of Maple  
in 1942 his reputation as the author  
of many worthwhile books for boys  
was already firmly established. Prob-  
ably few of his country neigh-  
bours realize that the story of how  
he attained that reputation is as in-  
spiring as any that he has written  
about other people. For, when Dr.  
Wallace began his career as an au-  
thor he was not sitting comfortably  
at a desk, but confined to bed with  
a serious breakdown in health, and  
facing the grave possibility, that,  
though still a young man, he might  
never be able to resume his minis-  
terial duties. Instead of giving in  
to self pity and despair he cast  
about for some way in which to use  
his active mind, and enforced leisure.  
Writing seemed to be the answer,  
especially writing for the teen age  
youth whose welfare was so close to  
his heart.

One of his pet theories is that in  
the life of every boy there comes a  
time when all he needs is a little  
push in one direction, or the other.  
Dr. Wallace set about giving that  
push in the right direction through-  
out, stimulating, biographical sketch-  
es of real boys who had made  
good, and even become famous, in  
different fields of endeavour, in  
spite of difficulties and disabilities.  
These stories first published in "The  
Canadian Boy" an influential church  
paper (of which Dr. Wallace later  
became editor) were so well received  
that they were soon reprinted in  
book form under the name "Stories  
of Grit". Other volumes followed,  
among them "Overcoming Handi-  
caps", "Adventures in the Air", and  
"Heroes of Peace". Some of these  
books have been translated into  
Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Hindu-  
stani, Portuguese, and braille and  
more than a million copies have been  
sold all over the world.

Dr. Wallace has also written sev-  
eral books for adults such as "I Be-  
lieve in People", "Stars in the Sky",  
"The Faith of Morn", and "The Sil-  
ver Lining".

Undoubtedly the courage and faith  
which permeate all his stories must  
have helped, and hastened, his re-  
turn to normal health. Today no  
one would think of illness in con-

**Langstaff Branch,  
Canadian Naval  
Cadet Corps**  
The shortest month has flown past  
and can the reader honestly say that  
you have learned something new, ac-  
complished anything for the better-  
ment of your mind or body? We  
have, yes, in the last four weeks we  
have been taught the Morse Code,  
the St. John's Sling; how to hold it,  
how to tie it with a square knot,  
and where the pressure points (26  
in all) of the body are located, as  
well as all the points of the compass.

We have met and had a talk with  
Captain Haysey, who joined the  
South African Mounted Rifles in  
1899. Served with the South African  
Field Forces 1903-1905, served in  
India and Burma in 1906-1909 and  
in 1914 till the end of World  
War I served under our flag in  
France, Italy and Germany. In him  
we met a gentleman, a world trav-  
elled scholar and a Captain of His  
Majesty's Forces.

We also had the pleasure of  
listening to Chief Engineer W. L.  
Levens, who joined the Royal Navy  
as a boy and came up the hard way,  
as there were no classes in his day  
to make seamanship easier for the  
boys that took it up.

Chief Engineer Levens, we found  
out, is very interested in our boys,  
and is willing to do anything in his  
power to help us. He told us of the  
compass, how it works aboard ship,  
how it turns and why. Chief Levens  
has seen service in South Africa  
in 1900. Stationed in China from  
1904-1907—Ashanti Station 1907-  
1908 and from there to the home  
port of England, thence to Canada—  
but back again in 1914 till he was  
wounded and sent home to Canada  
in 1917. He served two years as  
Chief Engineer in the Merchant Mar-  
ines in this present conflict—so you  
can readily see that we have the top  
men to teach us—how, where and  
why.

Now why don't you come out and  
bring your son or sons? You will  
enjoy it, your boy will benefit by it  
both physically and morally, as well  
as having some clean thoughts on  
his mind such as personal hygiene,  
first aid in all its branches, signal-  
ling four different ways, and how to  
conduct himself at all times as well  
as meeting other boys his own age.

Last week, February 26, we had  
25 boys out with two new members  
sworn in, and two visitors, Sgt. F.  
Meegan just back from three years  
overseas, who received the salute of

old may not fit into our group. Well  
we have seven members 16 years old  
as well as six members who are 17  
and four members over that. These  
boys come week after week, fair or  
stormy weather, so why not your  
son. We are open for boys from 12  
years and up, from Richmond Hill  
to Lansing.

The reason for forming this club  
was for the betterment of the boys  
and no money goes to either organ-  
izers or lecturers. Our dues are a  
five cent piece a week and you will  
know your boy is learning some-  
thing he can carry all his lifetime,  
in fact it is a chance of a lifetime  
for him.

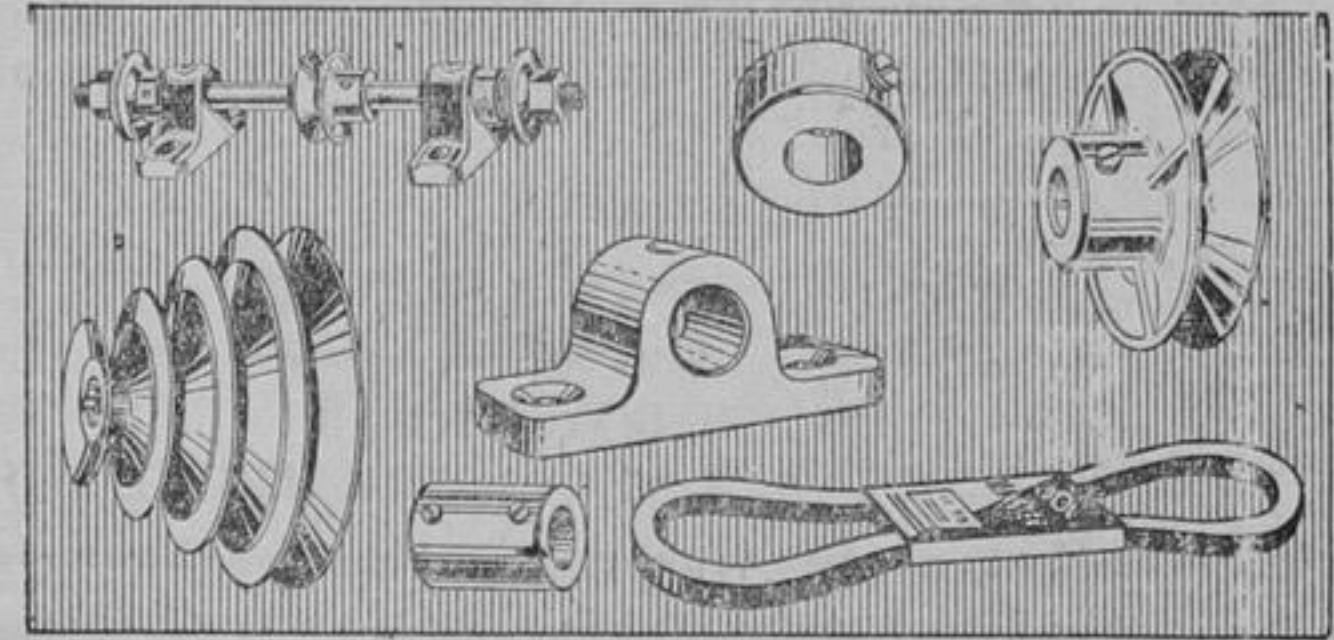
