CEILING PRICE SET FOR CHERRIES

Effective June 17 all domestic and imported cherries are to sell under a single ceiling, the Wartime Prices and Trade Board announced last week.

In Ontario the ceiling on producer sales to wholesalers or shippers is \$1.30 for a six-quart basket, and in British Columbia the producers' ceiling is \$2.65 per 15 pound case, and \$4.25 per 25 pound case.

The announcement points out that no changes have been made in last year's trucking zone in south-western Ontario—extending east to Kingston and north to the Severn River.

Outside the above zone shippers' mark-up is set at 10 per cent of grower price and wholesalers' mark-up is 12 1/2 of actual cost.
