

GUARDING PUBLIC HEALTH
So that Canadians may live better, safer and longer, health watchdogs stand at the very thresholds of biological science. Canada's soldiers of disease-prevention guard the quality and safety of everything for eating and drinking and of ingredients of drugs and medicines. National Health authorities are working with the family doctor, the specialist and the scientific explorer, in clinic and laboratory, for a healthier humanity.

SCHOOL LUNCHEES
Teachers, particularly in rural areas, who are interested in seeing that their pupils have proper noon-day meals, are notified by the Department of National Health and Welfare that guidance on organization of such lunches is available. Through Provincial Health departments, school teachers may obtain a film-strip entitled "The Rural School Lunch", which illustrates simple ways of planning a program of children's mid-day meals at school.

FISH LIVER OILS
Inclusion of fish liver oils in a child's diet, particularly in the winter months, to supply Vitamin D, required for building strong bones and healthy teeth, is recommended by the Department of National Health and Welfare, Ottawa. When the days are short, we cannot depend upon the sun's rays as a source of Vitamin D, but health authorities point out that this vitamin is found in fish liver oils, which should be served to compensate for the lack of sunshine.

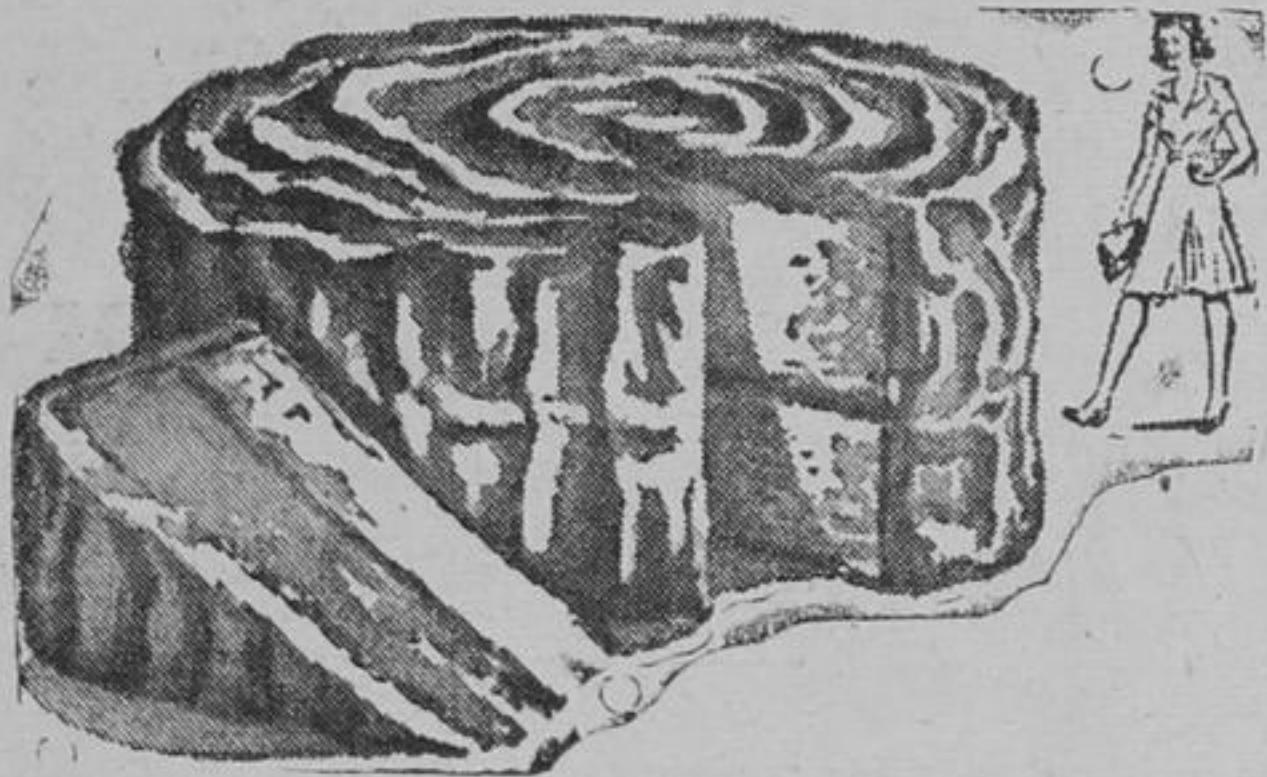
