When Mr. Drew introduced his liquor legislation, he used, to support his contentions, a forgery—a passage ascribed to that great humanitarian, Abraham Lincoln, whose authentic letters and speeches contain the most definite denunciations of the liquor traffic.

On a following evening he made an attack upon Russia, when, at the same time, our Minister of External Affairs, Mr. St. Laurent, was urging us to extend the hand of friendship to our northern neighbor.

Last Thursday, Mr. Blackwell, in his careful explanation of the new "temperance" legislation, stated that the provincial police would be sent into municipalities to enforce law and order if the municipal authorities were not able to cope with the situation.

The potency of the "softening-up" effect of liquor and incitement to war is nowhere better expressed than in A. E. Housman's little lyric: "Could men be drunk forever, With liquor, love, and fight, Lief would I rise at morning And lief lie down at night."

But men, at whiles, are sober And think by fits and starts And when they think — a dangerous thing to do, especially for youth — they might see the above inconsistencies.

LARGEST SUSPENSION BRIDGE IN EUROPE

With a centre span of 3,000 feet over the navigable waterway and two side-spans of about 1,000 feet each the proposed new Severn Bridge in Britain will be the largest in Europe and will exceed the span of the Oakland Bridge, San Francisco, by 700 feet though coming 1200 feet short of the Golden Gate Bridge, San Francisco.

The total span across the Severn will exceed by nearly 900 feet the span of the great bridge across Sydney Harbour.

The Severn Bridge will give shipping about 120 feet clearance at high water while the steel towers supporting the main cables and resting on concrete piers will rise to a height of 450 feet.
