### TREE PLANTER PLACES 8,000 SAPLINGS PER DAY

Unable to obtain sufficient labor for hand planting, about one hundred thousand saplings were planted out on lands bought by the County of York in Whitechurch and Georgina Townships this spring, with a mechanical planter. This machine, drawn by a caterpillar tractor, digs a wider furrow than the plow, and is capable of handling eight thousand trees a day of eight hours. It requires only the help of three men, one to drive the tractor, one to lift the saplings from a pail of water to another workman that places them in the furrow, as the machine proceeds at a pace similar to that for tractor plowing. The planter used in Whitechurch on county reforestation lands is owned by the Department and is used mostly on much larger projects. However, help was not available and the outfit enabled many acres to be reforested that otherwise would have gone unplanted.
