Many deaths by drowning are needless according to the Health League of Canada and could be prevented by the running of no unnecessary risks and by the prompt application and long continued use of artificial respiration methods when accidents do occur. Do not discontinue artificial respiration too soon because sometimes it has been successful after as many as five hours. Don't discontinue after a mere half-hour of effort; continue until there are definite signs of rigor mortis.
