OBITUARY

LATE ALLAN C. PHINNEY
Due to an accident the death occurred on Friday, October 10, 1947 of Mr. Allan C. Phinney of Richmond Hill, Ont.

The late Mr. Phinney was born at Gelert, Haliburton, in the year 1886 and was the eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Duncan Phinney.

His wife, the former Pearle Sedgwick, predeceased him 10 years ago. Mr. Phinney is survived by one son, John Randolph, of the R.C.M.P., stationed at D'Esconse, Cape Briton Island, Nova Scotia, and one daughter, Helen Candace (Mrs. A. Campbell) of Peterboro. Also six brothers and one sister survive.

For many years Mr. Phinney was section foreman for the C.N.R. and prior to his death served in a similar capacity for the T.T.C. on the line from Toronto to Richmond Hill.

In his younger days Mr. Phinney was greatly interested in music and later operated a private radio station at his own home in Richmond Hill at a time when local broadcasting was in its infancy. Possessed of a happy, cheerful temperament, Mr. Phinney made many friends and will be greatly missed.

The funeral was held on Monday, October 13 from the Bennett Funeral Home, Lansing, Ont. and was largely attended. The Rev. L. C. Secrett of St. George's Church, Willowdale had charge of the funeral service and interment followed at Richmond Hill cemetery.
