Urban and suburban residents are so accustomed to regular delivery of pasteurized milk, to their homes that they sometimes fail to realize — or forget — that raw milk exists in many vacation areas, and that raw milk can contain dangerous disease bacteria which can cause such serious illnesses as bovine tuberculosis, typhoid and para-typhoid fever, undulant fever, diphtheria, scarlet fever and septic sore throat. Insist on pasteurized milk at all times wherever you are or if it is absolutely unavailable then pasteurize it before using by "home" pasteurization methods. Play safe — protect your dear ones. 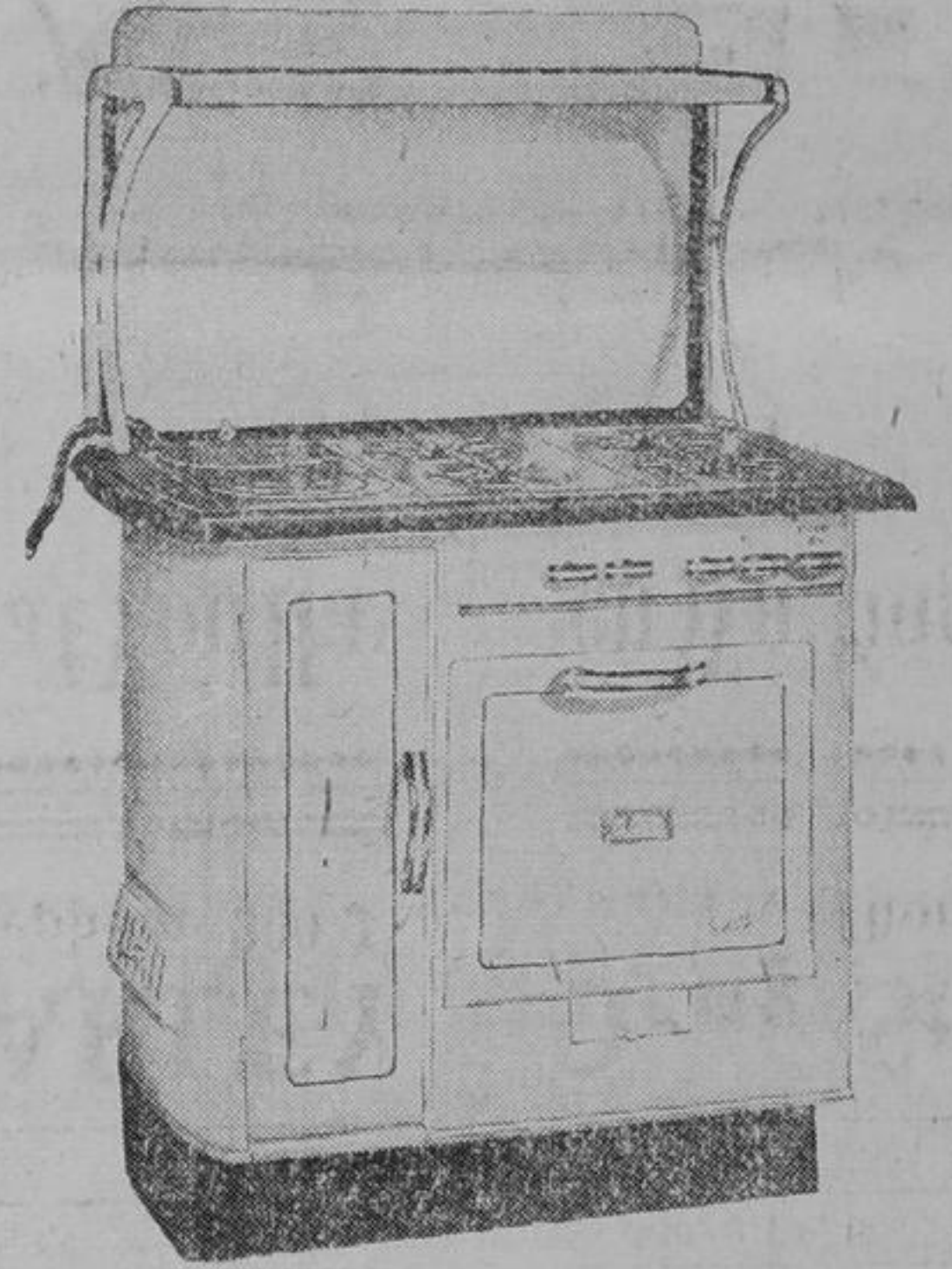
