## King City District News

George Cadden, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Bert Cadden, third concession of King who suffered serious chest injuries and seven broken ribs from collision with a panel truck driven by Orton Day, King R. R. 2, is now reported in favorable condition at the Toronto Western Hospital. Great concern was felt by his parents for a few days following the accident. The youth who has been employed for some time by Mervin Wilson who operates the John Dew farm at King, was struck by the truck backing up to the barn to take on a load of twine. The rear wheel of the vehicle was said to have passed over Cadden's chest, causing collapsed lung, shoulder injuries and broken ribs. He remained in an oxygen tent at hospital where he was removed by ambulance upon examination by Dr. J. L. Urquhart, Aurora, immediately after the incident. The community is greatly relieved to know he will now recover.

Hydro service was slightly disrupted in the King district last week when new lines were being strung on Yonge street, where a new sub station at Oak Ridges is being installed. Hydro officials said the new station will assume part of the load to relieve the situation in the area improving conditions in the district. This is a welcome facility to hydro users.

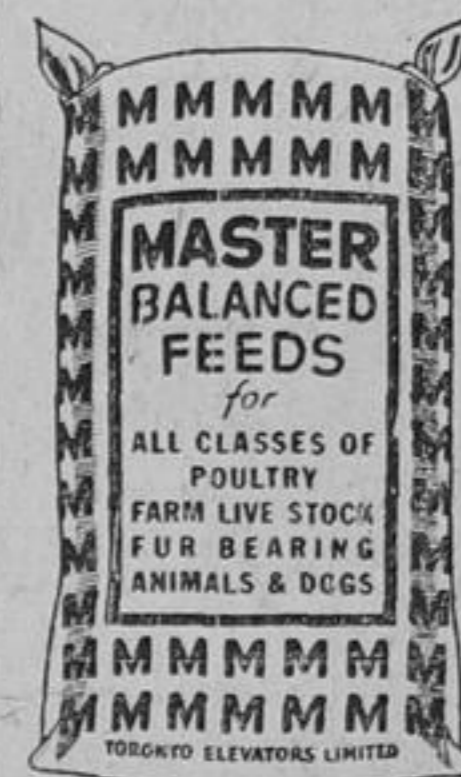
