Area seeded to wheat in Canada this year is estimated at 24,073,900 acres, a reduction of one per cent from the estimated 24,260,400 acres sown last year, according to figures released by the Bureau of Statistics. Area under oats is practically unchanged. Rye acreage is substantially increased, while that of barley showed a marked reduction. Hay and clover acreage is down two per cent, but alfalfa up four per cent. Acreage seeded to potatoes is one per cent higher.

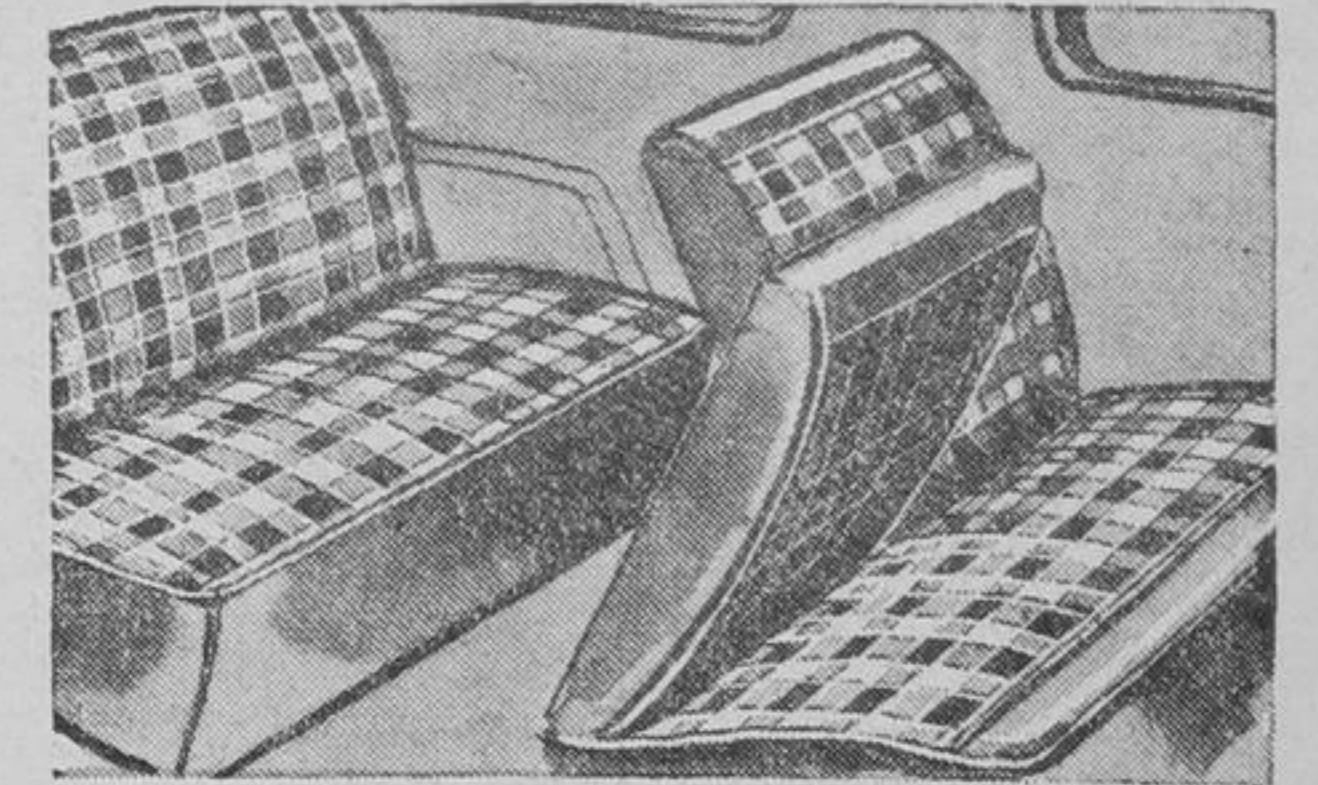

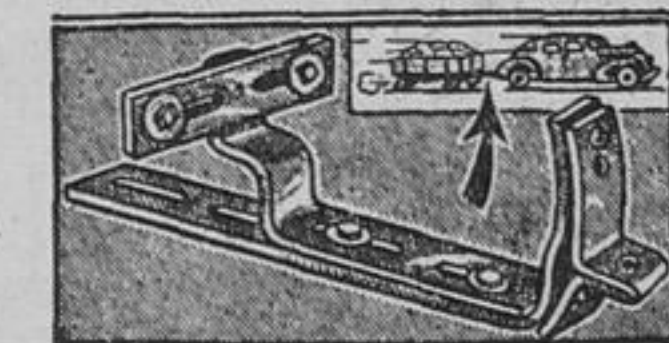

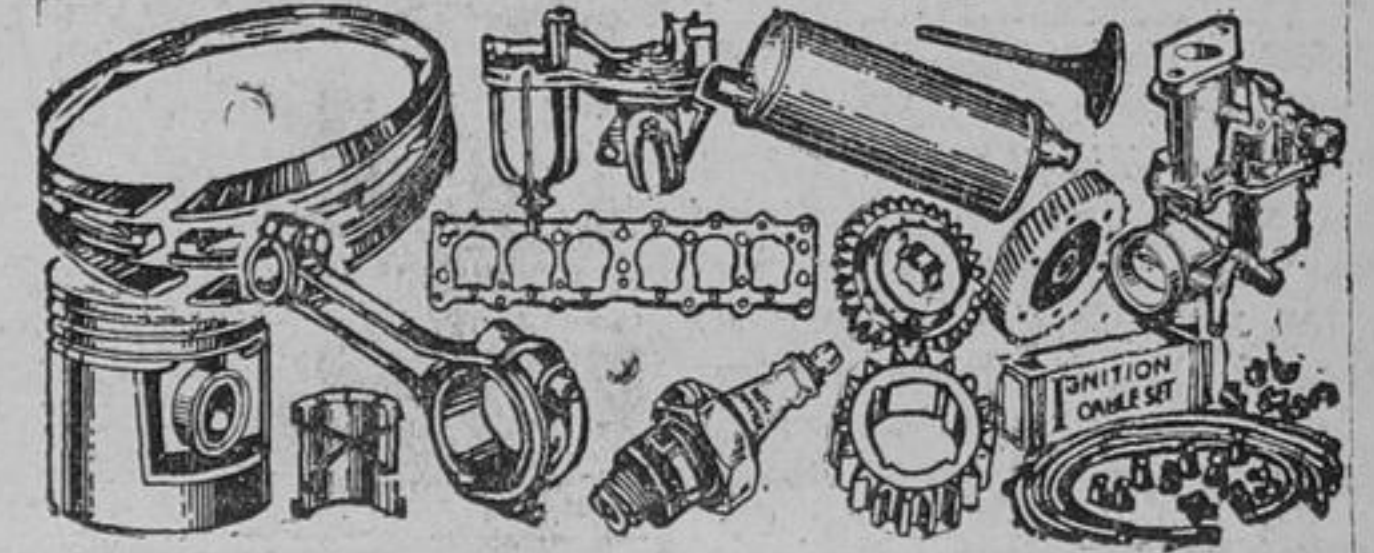
