Due to the province-wide shortage of electric power Richmond Hill like other municipalities has been placed on a quota.

Richmond Hill daily quota is now 6275 Kilowatts. Monday of this week our consumption was 8600 Kilowatts.

Richmond Hill consumers are asked to make a real effort to bring us speedily within our quota.

If the required result is not attained by voluntary effort there will be no alternative to complete cut-off of power for certain periods. We think this should not be necessary if every consumer will conserve power wherever and whenever possible.

If we are to have uninterrupted service it is important that everyone co-operate to the utmost right now.
