Queensville to Woodbridge nineteen  
young farm boys gathered last week  
at Vellore for their last regular York  
County Grain Club Meeting. The  
meeting got underway promptly with  
President Bob Hamilton in the chair  
and Secretary Glenn Atkinson, both  
of Schomberg recording. Several  
matters of business were covered with  
plans completed for the Judging  
Competition and examination to take  
place in the Newmarket Agricultural  
Office on Wednesday evening, Sep-  
tember 29. Points were delivered by  
Assistant Representative Archie Mc-  
Kenzie on cleaning up their grain for  
their Achievement Day Show at the  
Markham Fair and considerable men-  
tion made of cultural practices re-  
lating to the growing of good grain  
crops, this being a follow up to talks  
on smuts and rusts of grains at pre-  
vious meetings.

The boys had a change in receiving  
instruction and judging on classes of  
corn and potatoes. Following reas-  
ons taken by Ray Ingleton of Agin-  
court, club leader, it was found that  
Jim Sheardown, Schomberg, Trevor  
Watson, Agincourt and George Hoo-  
per of Gormley all had perfect plac-  
ings on all classes. The meeting ad-

courtesy of the York County Junior  
Farmers' Association.
