**DOUBLE BLOSSOM PETUNIA SEED TO BE AVAILABLE**  
Double petunia seed, which produces rare plants bearing double blossoms, will be available from Japan this fall for the first time since before the war. It is estimated that the Japanese will harvest, and have available for export in October, about ten pounds of double petunia seed. None will be sold in Japan. A harvest of 20 pounds is planned for 1948 which will about equal the amount exported annually before the war to the United States, the United Kingdom and other countries at prices ranging from \$250 to \$300 an ounce. An ounce contains about 280,000 seeds.

# Do You Want A BLACKOUT

## The Hydro Situation in Richmond Hill and District is Serious

To meet the emergency power shortage the Ontario Power Commission has placed each municipality on a quota basis, and the allotment to Richmond Hill is lower than the amount previously used.

Richmond Hill's daily quota now is 6275 Kilowatt Hours. Daily consumption has been running as high as 8600 Kilowatt Hours.

Unless use of electricity is reduced voluntarily at once, it will be necessary commencing Monday to have power cut off for fifteen minutes daily every hour, on the hour.

The simple fact is that unless the use of electricity is reduced now, it will be necessary to have blackouts.

SOME SUGGESTIONS ON HOW YOU CAN SAVE:

Do not use electric heaters as they place a heavy strain on your Hydro System.

Do your ironing on Saturday when there is surplus power.

Turn off all unnecessary lights. Don't forget about burning lights in empty rooms, halls, basement, attic, porch and garage. Eliminate all colored bulbs.

When kettle sings, turn off switch. Stored heat will bring it to a full boil. Keep kettle free from lime.

When cooking use "High" heat for as little time as possible. Then turn to "Low" and used stored heat.

Defrost refrigerator regularly, when 1/2" of frost has accumulated on the evaporator.

Where water is electrically heated, please use it sparingly. A drop a second from a leaking hot water tap can waste as much as 175 gallons a month.

Fill washing machine to water line only and keep lid on tub when washing. Do not overload.

Your toaster, vacuum cleaner or other electrical appliances should not be used any longer than required.

Reduce bulbs in all fixtures by 50 per cent.

This is a final appeal and last warning that the one way to avoid the hourly cut-off is to make substantial savings right now.
