



Such interruptions may be for fifteen minutes every hour on the hour, or at any other time the Commission may order.

Such further interruptions as may be necessary, after Friday October 8th, will be made without notice.

Voluntary reduction in use of power will help prevent further interruptions. IF EVERYONE SAVES a little, we can bring consumption down within our quota.
