North York Plowmen Compete On High Basis

Approximately ninety-nine percent of plowmen competing at the North York match held on the farm of Walter Wood, near Aurora, on October 20th were said by officials to have competed successfully at the International match at Lindsay. Judges stated quality of work exceeded that of the International and was witnessed by about 1,000 persons. Ideal weather and perfect soil conditions attracted 37 men and boy plowmen and one girl, Catherine Diceman, 16, of Queensville, who brought her own twin team of chestnut Belgians and plow. Catherine, the daughter of Ollie Diceman, formerly of Vaughan township won fourth for boys under 18 and under walking plow class, and came eighth in the same class at Lindsay. Catherine left school to help her father in the spring of 1947, and during that season plowed 70 acres of land beside assisting with other farm work. One Queensville man said his district was very proud of Catherine while Vaughan township felt they had something to do with the girl's ultimate success. Whichever way it goes, none of it goes to Catherine's head. She is steady, quiet, thoroughly absorbed in her plowmanship and the sturdy dependable type that knows no fatigue at the end of six hours' competition. She is plowing a the King and Vaughan match this week.

There were seven lads from the Timbers families through the county on hand; Bob Timbers of Stouffville, second class winner of the Esso trip to Britain prize for the International match, won the open tractor class in sod over eight competitors; Ernie Evans of Maple, 2nd; Joe Trann, Souffville, 3rd. All had been in the money at Lindsay.

Eugene Timbers, 15, Milliken, took boys 18 and under, walking plow class with Howard Timbers, Aurora, in second place. Eugene won the Silver Challenge Cup by Eglington Hunt Club for best plowed land and special as youngest plowman in the match. James Lee, 54, of Greenbank, special as oldest plowman. Dave Ratcliffe of Stouffville took Bruce Tractor special for most number of points for tractor plowed land.

Salada Tea special went to Harley Timbers of Unionville and Ernie Evans of Maple the Esso Tractor Special for best land jointer sod.

Other winners in horse plowing classes, Harley Timbers of Unionville, Carl Timbers, Aurora, open jointers. William Holder, Manilla, Harris Wright, Sutton, jointers. Barnell

Wylie, Oakwood, Roy Smith, Gormley, stubble. Jack Daney, Cannington, Horace Berwick, Holt, stubble open for those never winning prize at any match.

Leslie Smith, Gormley, Floyd Forsythe, Stouffville, open tractors in stubble, Ed Ferguson, Stouffville, Ivan De Geer, Stouffville, tractors (open to those never winning tractor prizes at matches.) George Timbers, Stouffville, Norman Tyndall, Richmond Hill, Row Crop tractor stubble, a new and added class.

No entries were filed in tractor in stubble class for boys 13 years and under.
