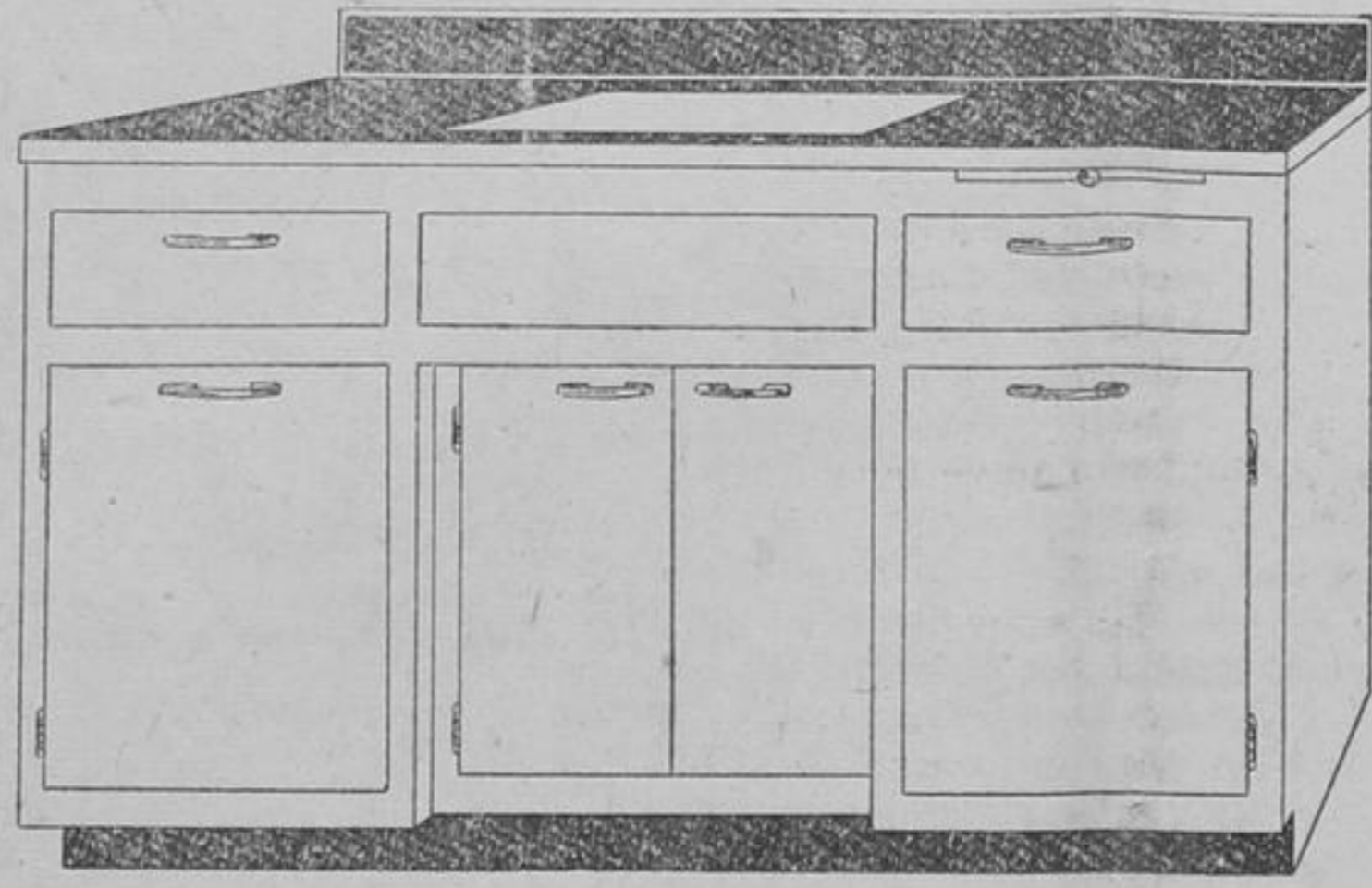

(Continued from Page 1) officers of the Council themselves could do the job adequately. Furthermore, he objected to restricting the building of smaller homes and to the insistence that business concerns be built 50 ft. from the line. He saw the new assessment system advocated as being too complicated and requiring more than one assessor. The contents of houses were not important, he said, only their square feet. In regard to the discontinuation of the North Yonge Railway, he considered the people should have been given a say, as he understands that the rates will be ultimately raised or the buses must run at a deficit. He complained that expenses for the year had been much too high and that the snow ploughing had not been adequately supervised.

The other nominees for the Council gave short addresses. Mr. Robert Rae suggested that for the hard times ahead a thrifty Scotchman such as himself be chosen to administer the public funds. Mr. Albert Reesor, placed himself in the position of a middle man. Whereas he felt some of the costs incurred by the council had been extravagant, he yet considered that many of the statements made by Mr. Hooper in criticism had been extravagant. He questioned the advisability of the Planning Advisory Board.

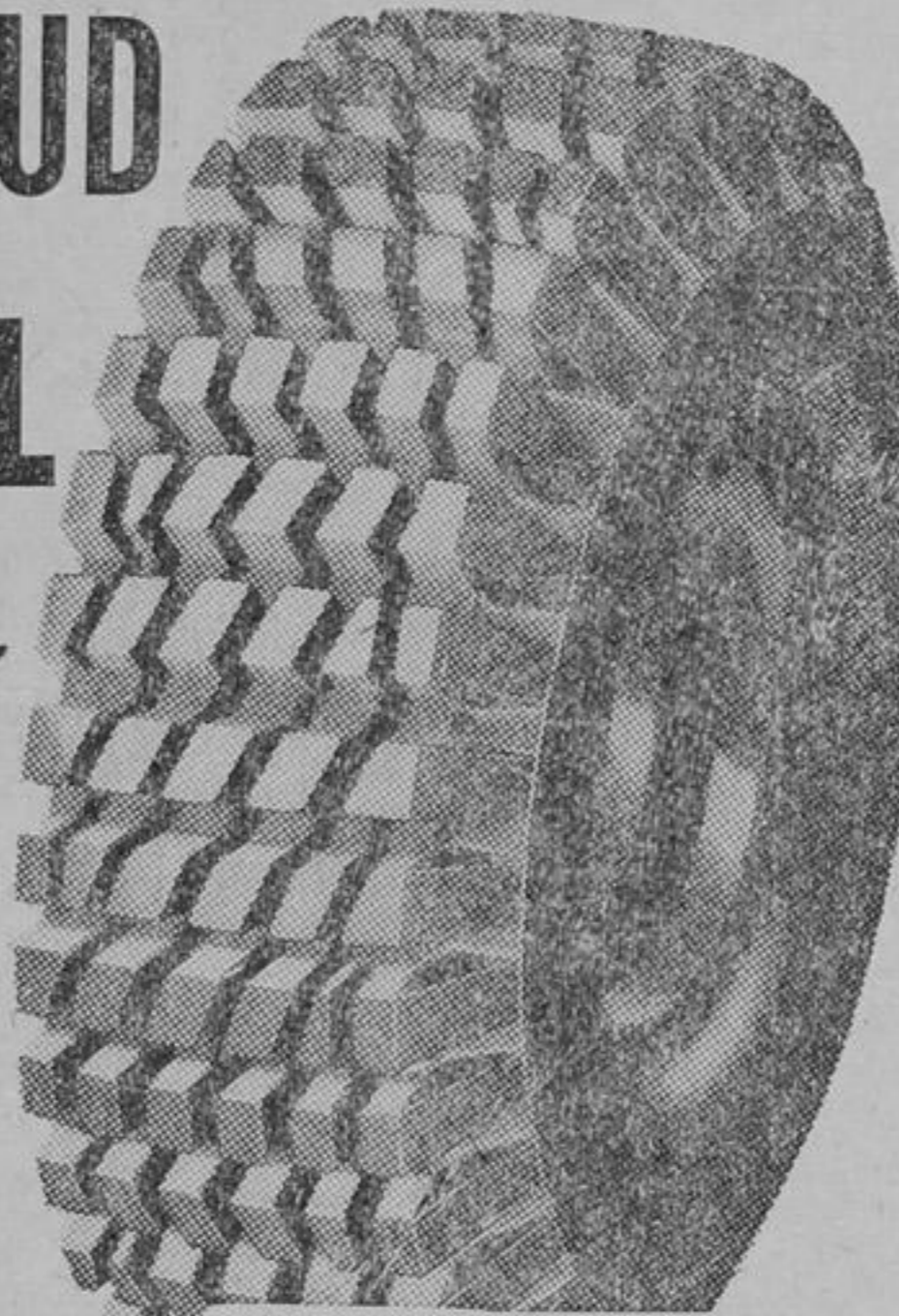
