Girl Guide Notes

An important event for Girl Guiding in this locality took place at Oak Ridges on Thursday, November 25th. The Oak Ridges Local Association for the Girl Guides, together with the members of the Guide Company and Brownie Pack were at home to their mothers and to Guide leaders and District Commissioners from Thornhill, Richmond Hill, Aurora and Newmarket. The Area Commissioner, Mrs. H. R. Howden, was guest of honour and some outstanding Guider trainers of the Province were also present.

Thornhill was represented by the Local Association member, Joyce Healey, Lieutenant and Ann Sanderson, Tawny Owl. Richmond Hill was represented by Miss Izzard, District Commissioner, Agatha Markey, Brown Owl, and Catherine Smith, Lieutenant.

Aurora was represented by Miss Betty Cody, District Captain, Mary Annan, Captain, Mrs. Heaton, Brown Owl, Mrs. Holder, Tawny Owl. Newmarket was represented by Mrs. Boudreau, District Commissioner, and Mrs. Grant Delane, Lieutenant.

In each district where there is a Girl Guide Company or Brownie Pack, there is a Local Association for the Girl Guides. This is composed of representative women in the district who are interested in Guiding. It is the duty of this Association, headed by the District Commissioner, to find suitable leaders, to recommend them for appointment, and to obtain for them further training when necessary. Also the Local Association arranges for suitable meeting places for Companies, and in every possible way gives its moral support and encouragement to all Guiding in the district.

The guests of the evening were received by District Commissioner, Mrs. D. R. Gunn and Mrs. Peter Hughey, Captain, and Mrs. W. Hudson, Brown Owl. Mrs. H. R. Howden, introduced by Mrs. Gunn, spoke on Proficiency Badges. Stressing the importance of high standards in tests, it was pointed out that by wearing one of these badges the Guide is marked as a person able to give efficient service to others in the particular field represented.

Mrs. Howden presented second class badges to Patrol Leader Helen Teravain, Second Marilyn Comfort, and to Jean Teravain. Marion Dion has also qualified for this test but through an unfortunate misunderstanding her badge was not presented.

Mrs. Peter Hughey received her Warrant pin as Captain, and Mrs. W. Hudson, her Warrant pin as Brown Owl. The first two Brownies in the pack to earn their Golden Bars were invested in a special ceremony including the whole pack. This was conducted by Miss Attwood, Provincial Brownie trainer, and Mrs. Hudson. Miss Eehlin, Provincial Camp Trainer spoke on camping, giving an outline of the high standards maintained in all Guide Camps. There is strict supervision of all water sports, and rigid controls of drinking water and milk and for everyone an opportunity to learn how to be comfortable through camping.

A delicious buffet supper was served. All arrangements for the supper were made by eight Guides who were trying for their hostess badge. Seventy guests sat down to supper and real credit is due to these girls who did their share to make the evening a success.

After supper every one joined in a camp fire circle and, under the direction of Miss Mary Willett and Miss Eehlin, enjoyed half an hour of songs and games and stories.

Special guests of the evening not already mentioned, were Scoutmaster F. Lynn, and Principal and Mrs. J. Martin. Mr. Martin is Scoutmaster of the Maple Troop.
