Early in the century Mr. McCallum gave up farming and went west, finally settling in Grand Forks, B.C., where he was a successful business personality. For the past few years he had lived retired. Surviving are his wife, the former Margaret McGillivray of Bruce, Ont.; two sons, two daughters and three grandchildren, all living in British Columbia.

Bridegroom Dies

Joseph L. Fletcher, 25, prominent farmer of Binbrook, near Hamilton, died on Saturday, November 27, in Hamilton General Hospital little more than a week after he was kicked in the back by a cow, causing serious internal injuries. Ten weeks ago on that date he had married Verna Bryson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Bryson of Vaughan township, at a ceremony held in the Laskay United Church. The couple were occupying the Fletcher farm, representing the fourth generation of the Fletcher family on the same farm.

Mr. Fletcher was not thought to have been seriously hurt at first and had attended a farm group meeting shortly afterward, developing signs of grave illness. Two operations had been performed. It was said when necessary drugs ran out in Hamilton his older brother, Stephen, raced to Toronto and back in two hours on Friday, but too late to save the young man's life.

Deceased was a member of one of the district's oldest and most prominent families. His father is Reeve Hiram Fletcher, prominent in milk producers organizations, and last year represented them in Europe conferences. Surviving are his bride, his parents, an older brother, Stephen of Eastbourne Ave., Hamilton, and his younger brother, Donald at medical school of the University of Western Ontario, London.

The funeral was held from Trinity United church, interment in Trinity cemetery on Tuesday afternoon. Rev. M. R. Jenkinson of King, who married the couple, assisted with the service. Many friends of the district were present. The tragic and early passing of the young man has aroused widespread sympathy for his bride and his family. They were not yet fully established in their home. The shock and loss to wife of deceased is indeed unspeakable.

Mr. and Mrs. Ross Follitt of Strange are happy in the birth of their son, George Edward Follitt, which occurred on Saturday, November 13, at York County hospital. The little chap weighed six pounds 13 ounces at time of birth and is doing well.
