



Those present at the nomination meeting Monday, November 29th, at Unionville, will remember I asked for information on several accounts in the treasurer's report, and I produced figures on the high cost of operating the Township truck, but I received only one answer, and that one answer, according to Township files, was incorrect.

Time will not permit my calling to see every elector, but I trust you will exercise your franchise to elect me as Reeve for 1949, and I can assure you I can give experienced leadership, lower taxes, with good sound administration in both Township and County business and problems coming before council.
