Santa Claus Mousse

1 16 oz. pkg. frozen strawberries (syrup pack)

2 tablespoons sugar or white corn

3 teaspoons gelatine

4 tablespoons cold water 1/2 cup whipping cream

½ teaspoon vanilla

Thaw strawberries, press through for garnishing). Add remaining juice from berries to make up 11/3 cups. Add sugar or corn syrup. tablespoons cold water and dissolve over hot water. Add to the berry mixture, pour into refrigerator tray and partially freeze.

Soak the remaining 1 teaspoon of gelatine in the remaining 2 tablespoons of cold water and dissolve over hot water. Whip cream, add gelatine, sugar and vanilla and mix well. Spread as topping over berry mixture in refrigerator tray. Return to refrigerator and continue freezing until firm, about 1 to 2 hours. Garnish with a few whole berries. Yield: six servings.

Cherry Sauce

11/2 cups frozen sour red cherries 1/2 cup cherry juice

1/4 cup sugar

18 teaspoon cinnamon Few drops almond extract

2 teaspoons cornstarch 1 tablespoon water

Drain cherries and add sufficient water to cherry juice to make 34 cup. Add sugar, cinnamon and almond extract. Simmer 5 minutes. Mix cornstarch with water. Add to the syrup. Cook 5 minutes or until slightly thickened. Add cherries. Serve as a sauce for puddings or plain cake. Yield: 11/2 cups.

Raspberry Snow

4 tablespoons cornstarch

1/3 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon salt 2 cups boiling water 3 tablespoons lemon juice (1 lemon) 1 tablespoon grated lemon rind

2 egg whites.

1 16 oz. package frozen raspberries (thawed) Mix cornstarch, sugar and salt

thoroughly. Gradually add boiling water, stirring constantly. Cook over low heat until thick and clear, about ten minutes. Add lemon juice and grated rind and pour slowly over siffly beaten egg whites, stirring untill well blended. Fold in drained raspberries. Yield: six servings.

This may be served with custard sauce or the fruit juice (4 cup) left from the fruit, thickened with 12 teaspoons cornstarch.
