ateur Entertainment entries in the
Zone 3 contests. Previous county el-
imination contests had declared Myr-
na Coulson of the Unionville Club the
public speaking winner and Margar-
et Watson's "Vellore Troupers" com-
posed of Duncan Watson, Wood-
bridge, Mason Fletcher, Woodbridge
and Don Maidment, Woodbridge, the
Amateur Entertainment winners.

In the zone competitions these en-
trants competed against North Sim-
coe, South Simcoe, Peel, Dufferin,
Grey, Bruce and Wellington. Mr.
Stan Steen, District Director for
Peel and Dufferin directed the even-
ing and was assisted by other juniors
particularly George Faris from South
Simcoe and Phyllis Black from Peel
who kept the group well entertained
during the sing song. The judges
included two ladies and one gentle-
man, Mrs. Dorothy Bowman from
Newmarket Dramatic Director at the
summer Junior Farmer Camp acted
as one official and made a splendid
commentary.

Competing against stiff competi-
tion Myrna Coulson led the Public
Speaking Entrants with her appropri-
ate and well delivered address on
"Youth and Its Responsibilities." The
judges commented on this address
for its sincerity assize and mode of
delivery. Other camper juniors will
recall Myrna's oratorical ability when

Myrna will now enter the finals in
competition with other zone winners
at the Federation of Agriculture An-

address the contestants will be called
upon to deliver a three-minute im-
promptu speech. In second place at
Camilla was Jean Black from the
Bolton Junior Farmers in Peel Coun-
ty speaking on the same subject fol-
lowed by Francis Boyle the Bruce
County entry, speaking on "Well
Diggers."

tet of junior farmers from South
Simcoe County captured first hon-
ours in the entertainment contest for
their renditions of songs which in the
judges' opinion had not only rhythm
and harmony but a distinct finish and
polish to their work. In second place
was a pantomime play and party
staged by the Ripley group from
Bruce county and in third place was
the "Vellore Troupers" from the
Vellore Club in York County. The

judges enjoyed very much the vari-
ety of entertainment in the York
group and appreciated their rhythm
but admitted the renditions were
somewhat stiff. The Trixie Junior
Farmers from Peel had a very enter-
taining tumbling act.

LIVELY CHRONICLE OF CANADA
New book "Harvest Triumphant"
Tells Story of 100 Year Company
Harvest Triumphant — the story
of Massey-Harris by Merrill Denison,
McClelland and Stewart \$3.50.
"Unaccustomed as we are," says
William Arthur Deacon, Literary Ed-
itor of The Globe and Mail, "to indus-
trial history, it must come as a sur-
prise that the most important histor-
ical narrative published in Canada
this year is the story of Massey-
Harris. Still more surprising is the
fact we have here no mere vault of
success in dollars, nor only informa-
tion about the mechanical improve-
ment of machines, but social history
of an engrossing nature."
The story written by the facile and
forceful writer, Merrill Denison, au-
thor of Klondike Mike and other
books is the story of Canada's growth
and development, the opening up and
settlement of the West, and the pros
and cons of the ubiquitous tariff ques-
tion.

In terms that are intelligible and
interesting to the general reader, the
author traces the influence of agri-
cultural mechanization on the world's
economy.
As a footnote to Canadian history
it is a new and illuminating picture
of Canada's social and economic de-
velopment, hitherto a largely neglec-
ted field, that will prove of absorbing
interest to the general reader. The
book is highlighted by sets of illus-
trations based on authentic historical
prints and records.


