**NORTH YONGE PROFIT \$19,859**  
The North Yonge railway line earned a \$19,859 profit last year, North York township council learned yesterday. The 1947 profit was \$6,654. The difference was made up by \$24,300 in increased operating expenses, even though passenger revenue increased by \$17,638. Reeve George H. Mitchell said. He said increased mileage and the operation of a special York Mills bus mean greater costs. The Bathurst bus lines showed a \$15,772 profit compared to \$8,500 last year.
