MISSIONARY AND EXPLORER T. E. Plewman Dies at Toronto
Thomas Edgar Plewman, 72, missionary in China for 30 years and fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, died suddenly on Thursday, February 24th, from a heart attack.

After a few years with the Rye-son Press, Methodist publishing house, he was sent to China by the foreign mission board of the church. He was placed in charge of all Methodist publications in China, and spent his holidays in travelling through China and Tibet. Upon his return he traversed the world to visit members of the Plewman family in various countries.

Surviving are his widow, St. Ives Cres., Toronto; two sons, George E. and W. Howard Plewman; two daughters, Barbara E. and Mrs. Bruce Witherspoon; two grandchildren; five brothers, W. R. Plewman and Charles F. Plewman, both of Toronto; A. E. Plewman, Richmond Hill; Harold Plewman, Hamilton; and George Plewman, North Bay; and two sisters, Miss Mabel Plewman and Mrs. Norman Anderson, both of Toronto.
