### Special Consideration Requests Discussed By Markham Council

Discussions on special considerations to be given to police villages and other settlements occupied a considerable amount of the time of Markham Township Council at its regular meeting, at which Reeve Vere Griffin presided, held at Unionville on April 4th.

A request from Unionville for special treatment was given attention but the council made it plain that general administration costs equivalent to those borne by other parts of the township must be paid.

In the event that an agreement between Markham Township and the Police Village of Unionville cannot be consummated on this basis, Reeve Griffin will recommend to Council that they impose on the Police Village of Unionville the Township General Rate which was 9 1/2 mills last year. Unionville's only recourse then will be to appeal to the County Judge for an interpretation of the direction given by the late Judge Parker last year.

A discussion with trustees of Thornhill village was also held, and it appeared as though a workable agreement would be forthcoming.

The contract for gravel for township roads for 1949 was awarded to the Stouffville Sand and Gravel Co., Ltd. The price is to be \$1.30 a yard delivered, with deliveries being effected on a tonnage basis in order to ensure receipt of full measure.

Among other routine matters the council adopted by-laws appointing village officials. That concerning the township assessor was laid over pending discussion of assessment methods with the present incumbent.


