Separate tenders will be received on the following: Foundations; Building Superstructure; Installation and Piping of Filtration Equipment; Plumbing; Roofing; and Electrical. Bidders may bid on one, or all, or any combination of the six separate tenders.

Each tender must be accompanied by a certified cheque for 5% of the amount of the tender, made payable to the Township of Vaughan Recreation Committee, Swimming Pool Account.
