

WRESTLING SEASON STARTS AT ARENA TUESDAY, JUNE 7

Under the auspices of the East Vaughan Ratepayers' Association an all-star wrestling card will be presented in Richmond Hill Arena on Tuesday, June 7th. This will be the first of a series which will be staged every other Tuesday until late October.

The main bout will bring together two outstanding Canadian middle-weight wrestlers. Red Garner, popular local boy, will lock horns with Ernie Hughson, one of the best grapplers to appear in a local ring. The bout will be two out of three falls and is over a sixty minute time limit.

In a second main bout Ed Mangotich, rugged Ryding boy, will meet the "Red Devil," who will make his first appearance at the local Arena. The Devil has rolled up an impressive record, having met and defeated some of the most outstanding Canadian wrestlers. In Mangotich he will have his hands full and perhaps Mangotich will be the one to unmask the devil.

Tom (Junior) Cooney, Richvale Flash, will match holds with Bobby Olsen, who hails from Jamestown, N.Y., in the preliminary match. Tom has shown constant improvement in recent workouts and will be in there with the idea of winning as speedily as possible.

As mentioned, these bouts will be staged by the East Vaughan Ratepayers' Association, which is helping the Community Hall Building Fund and at the same time, helping to develop Canadian talent. Popular prices will prevail, ringside being 75c, general admission 50c, children 25c. Doors will open at 7:30 p.m. with the first bout starting at 8:30 p.m.

RICHVALE
