




The 1949 International Plowing Match is being held at the farm of H. W. Amy, 10 miles west of Brantford, Ont., October 11 to 14. The plowmen's annual classic will be officially opened on October 12 by Brig. O. M. Martin of Brantford. Premier Cecil Frost of Ontario will be the guest speaker at the banquet marking the close of the match.

Second prize winners in the Trans-Atlantic classes which are sponsored by Imperial Oil, will each receive a silver medal and \$150 in cash. Twelve other cash prizes totalling \$165 will be awarded in each class.


