'WAY BACK WHEN

(Excerpts from the LIBERAL files of July 5, 1923)

"With a key of gold the orphanage at Elgin Mills was opened Monday. The ceremony was attended by about 1,500 people, including many prominent members of Orange Order throughout the province. About eighty children arrived that day from the Picton Orphanage, which is now closed."

"That the death of Leonard Curtis of Richmond Hill, who was killed by a Metropolitan radial car near Thornhill on June 11, was purely accidental, was the verdict of Coroner W. L. Bond's jury, which sat on Thursday evening. According to the evidence of several witnesses, Curtis drove his motor in front of the car, and the motorman was unable to stop in time to avert an accident."

"In drawing attention to the progress which is being made along Yonge Street and other parts of York County near the city, the Toronto Globe says: 'Richmond Hill will double in population in the next five years if the increase continues at its present rate! If we can get houses built fast enough we have no doubt the Globe is within the mark.'"

"The massed choir comprising the four church choirs of the village is holding practices every Thursday evening in the Masonic Hall, all of which augurs well for the success of the big union service in the park on August 5."

"A petition is being circulated asking the village council to cooperate with the county and the railway with a view to removing the track to the centre of Yonge Street. Everybody would like to see the railway in the centre but when the cost to Richmond Hill is given, \$42,000, it is little wonder that some of our citizens declined to sign the petition."

"A large number of our citizens journeyed to Markham on Monday afternoon and enjoyed the program put on for the last day of the 50th anniversary of the place as a village."

"A party of midnight prowlers entered the premises of Mr. E. R. Fortner, clothier ad tailor, Tuesday night and carried away with them practically all the cloth in the shop, as well as six or seven ready-made suits, to the value of about \$600. They entered by the back door leading to the kitchen by boring a small hole through the screen door, which they were then able to open, and cut out a panel of glass in order to unlock the door."
