ASK BETTER SERVICE

**Vaughan Councillors Join In Protest
 Against Overcrowded Yonge Buses**

Relief may be in sight for those who are complaining of the overcrowding of the North Yonge buses.

An informal discussion between Reeve George Mitchell of North York Township, Reeve Vern Griffin of Markham Township, and a senior official of the Toronto Transportation Commission led to the revelation that the Commission is already giving study to the setting up of a half hour service on the northern part of the run, replacing the forty minute service now in effect. It is said to be likely that where necessary two buses will be employed on each run in-

stead of one. In the meantime overcrowding is continuing to be a serious problem, resulting in much dissatisfaction among patrons of the line. Particularly bad during morning and evening rush hours, the service still seems to be inadequate at other times of the day. For instance, the bus leaving the Toronto City limits at one a.m. on a recent date had 29 passengers standing at the beginning of its trip. The bus was nearly to Thornhill before the last standee could secure a seat. **Vaughan Council Protests** At a recent meeting Vaughan township council adopted a resolution which was moved by Jas. H.

Robson and seconded by Carl Shaw. It reads "Whereas ratepayers in Vaughan Township have requested additional buses to alleviate crowded conditions on buses and whereas Markham township council by resolution have requested a revision of the time table. Be it therefore resolved that the Council of the township of Vaughan request the Toronto Transportation Commission to revise the time table for the North Yonge Transportation system to alleviate crowded conditions on the buses. The resolution of Markham township which is referred to was adopted by the council of that municipality on October 17.

Backing Of Salvation Army Is Arranged By Local Lions

A carefully prepared plan for canvassing the Village of Richmond Hill for funds in the Salvation Army's Red Shield Campaign was laid before the Richmond Hill Lions Club by Lion Wyck Trench, who has supervised this effort in previous years. The village was divided into twenty zones and twenty volunteer canvassers have been given their respective areas to work in. It is hoped that the people will live up to their previous outstanding generosity and oversubscribe this very worthwhile cause. The campaign will begin on Tuesday, November 1, and continue for one week.

An outstanding resume of activities of the various committees of the Richmond Hill Lions Club was given to the Deputy-District Governor, Lion Fred Campbell, on the occasion of his visit of inspection last Thursday night. All the committees reported either on what they had recently accomplished or on their plans for the immediate future.

In the absence of Lion Paul Angle, Chairman of the Community Hall and Civic Projects Committee, Lion Tom Lamb gave an encouraging report on the progress of the Community Hall Commission. He told of a visit to Brampton by the Commission to look at a new hall erected there by the Junior Farmers. Our own hall was now in the architect's hands, he stated, and it was hoped to begin construction in the spring. Lion Tom also spoke of co-operation with the Boys' and Girls' Committee to instal a drink-

ing fountain in the park. Lion Stan Ransom of this committee told of the work accomplished in the park during the summer months repairing the swings, etc., and providing sporting instruction for the younger children. The outdoor rink would be put into operation again this year and would be supervised by the Lions, he announced.

The Chairman of the Welfare Committee, Lion Herb Butt, told of purchasing a Dunlopillo mattress for a bedridden patient in the community and of providing transportation for an arthritic patient to and from the hospital for treatment. He asked members and other citizens to report to him any other cases of local people in need of assistance so that the work of this committee may be extended to all those in need of it.

The Deputy Governor, in his address, spoke of the many horizons that were being opened in the world of today. He spoke of the new nations and their efforts to expand and improve the conditions of the people living in them and of the greater areas for established nations, like our own, to extend a helping hand. Lions International, he explained, was pushing its organization as quickly as possible to other countries in the world and he predicted that in a very few years hence this great force for good would be established in all the free countries of the world. Lion Fred was thanked and presented with roses on behalf of the Club by Lion Ken Tomlin.

Air Vice Marshal Will Be Speaker At RCAF Meeting

Air Vice Marshal G. E. Brookes, Ontario provisional president of the RCAF Association will be guest speaker at the organization meeting of a Richmond Hill Wing of the RCAF, Nov. 18 in the Municipal Hall. Other guests invited are Reeve P. C. Hill, J. E. Smith, M.P. for North York, and Lt. Col. F. J. Picking of The Liberal.

A highlight of the evening will be the showing of a 40-minute sound film — "Wasp Wings." This is a film dealing with RCAF Fighter Squadrons overseas. It covers England, Italy, Normandy, France and Germany, and has been exceptionally well received wherever shown.

Election of officers will also take place at this meeting as well as appointing a committee to draw up a constitution and by-laws, a membership committee and program committee. It's hoped that all ex-RCAF personnel as well as present members of the regular RCAF will be present. 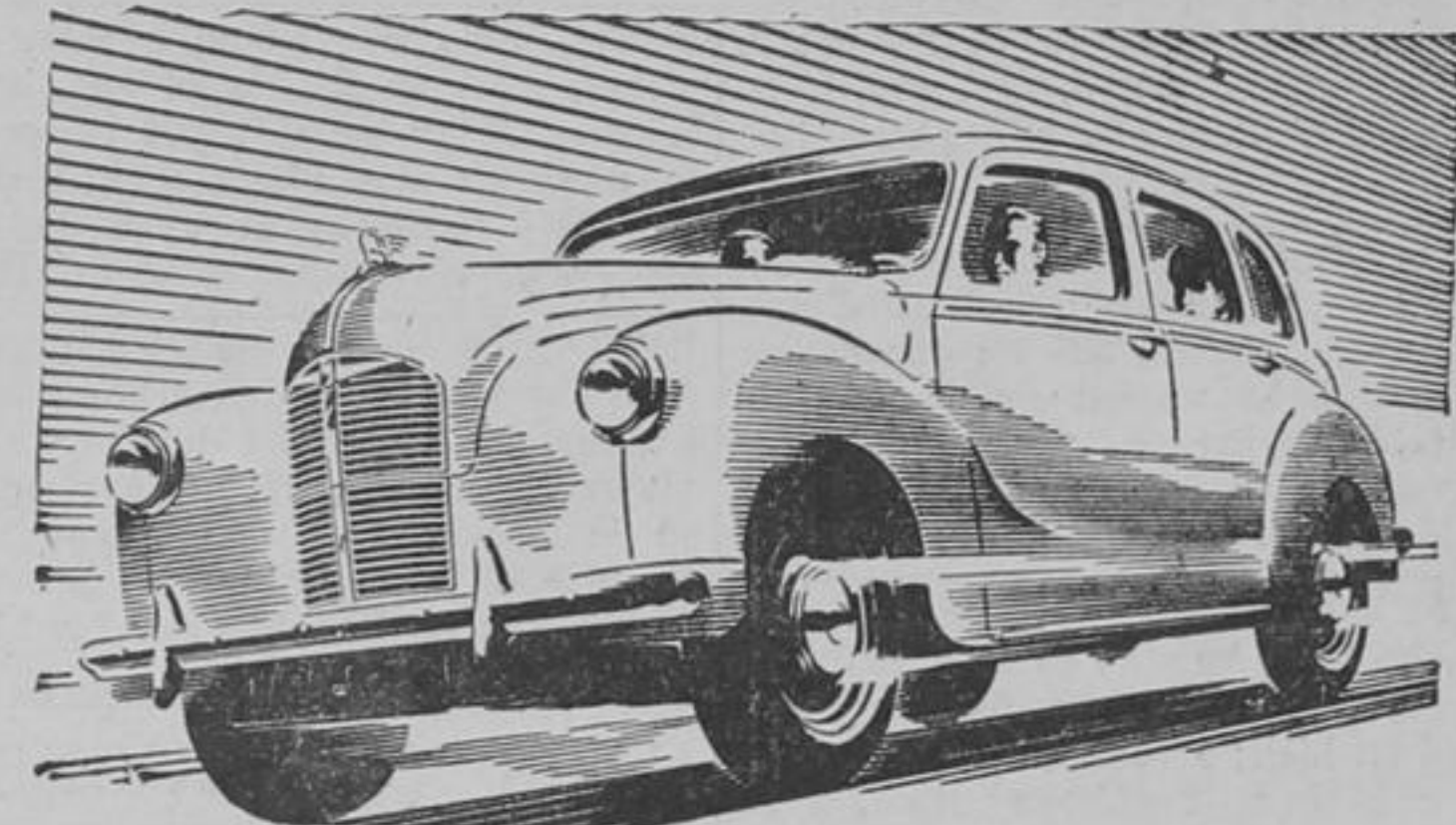
