Mr. and Mrs. Dale have altogether nine grandchildren and eight great grandchildren. His trade as a butcher, as well as being a member of the Snodland Fire Brigade while in London, kept all of Mr. Dale's time occupied. He had the privilege of making sausages for Queen Victoria. Later in Canada he established a store on College St.

Although still fond of the old country Mr. Dale said "We have never wanted to go back to England — we are quite satisfied and happy in Canada." In speaking of his home in London Mr. Dale mentioned that he was the owner of the first motor car in the County of Kent. The car had but one cylinder and wasn't powerful enough to go up even a small hill. "We had to wait at the bottom of the hill until a horse and wagon came along to pull us up the grade."

At the young ages of 86 and 85, Mr. and Mrs. Dale are living a quiet but full life. They received many bouquets of flowers and congratulatory notes on their anniversary and were visited by many friends who wished them many more years of happiness.
